- 1. Consider approval of the minutes of the September 21, 2010 Regular Meeting.
- 2. Consider approval of the following bids:
 - a. Screening Wall Replacement

This request is for the demolition of an existing 6-foot screening wall and the construction of a new 6-foot masonry screening wall. The replacement of sidewalks and ramps are also included.

This request is to provide labor necessary to remove and replace existing underground cable in the ongoing Distribution Maintenance Program.

This request is to provide labor necessary to remove approximately 14 miles of existing static line and replace it with new composite fiber optic ground wire from Elm Grove Switching Station to the Olinger Plant to complete a fiber link from Ben Davis to Olinger.

d. New Construction – 1002 and 1006 Cabana Lane Bid No. 413-10 Home Infill Project

This request is for the construction of two single family homes on property using HOME Infill Grant funding.

3. A public hearing was previously conducted for the following zoning case. Council approved the request and instructed staff to bring forth the following ordinance for consideration.

Zoning File No. 10-25, Jerry Bell

Approval of an ordinance will approve a Specific Use Permit for Major Automotive Repair on a 0.805-acre tract of land zoned Commercial-1 Uses located at 428 North First Street, southeast of the intersection of North First Street and West Walnut Street.

4. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a Project Supplemental Agreement with Dallas County for roadway improvements to Pleasant Valley Road from Firewheel Parkway to Richfield Drive.

The 2004 Bond Referendum and the approved 2010 Capital Improvement Program included funds to partner with Dallas County in the reconstruction and widening of Pleasant Valley Road from Firewheel Parkway to Richfield Drive. At the September 20, 2010 Work Session, Council considered authorizing a Project Supplemental Agreement with Dallas County in order to proceed with the construction.

5. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a Project Supplemental Agreement with Dallas County for roadway improvements to Shiloh Road from IH-635 to Kingsley Road.

The 2004 Bond Referendum and the approved Capital Improvement Program included funds to partner with Dallas County in the reconstruction and widening of Shiloh Road from IH-635 to Kingsley Road. At the September 20, 2010 Work Session, Council considered authorizing a Project Supplemental Agreement in order to proceed with the construction.

6. Consider by minute action authorizing the City Manager to execute a design contract with Nathan D. Maier Consulting Engineers, Inc.

The 2010 Capital Improvement Program includes funding for design and coordination activities associated with Shiloh Road from IH-635 to Kingsley. A contract in the amount of \$346,655 has been negotiated with Nathan D. Maier Consulting Engineers, Inc. for the design and preparation of construction plans and specifications. This item was considered by Council at the September 20, 2010 Work Session.

7. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into a contract with the Texas State Library and Archives Commission to operate the Northeast Texas Library System (NETLS); to submit annually a grant application and program of service to operate NETLS.

The City of Garland contracts annually with the Texas State Library and Archives Commission to operate the Northeast Texas Library System (NETLS). At the September 20, 2010 Work Session, Council considered authorizing the approval of the State Fiscal Year 2011 NETLS Operating Grant Contract. The City will receive \$643,233 for operation of the NETLS service program through the Nicholson Memorial Library System during State Fiscal Year 2011 (September 1, 2010 through August 31, 2011), including a projected \$30,633 in indirect costs as City revenues.

8. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute and administer a grant with the Texas State Library and Archives

Commission; providing that the Nicholson Memorial Library System will provide certain services.

The City of Garland contracts with the Texas State Library and Archives Commission to administer the program for the Northeast Texas Library System through the Nicholson Memorial Library System. The program is fully funded by the State of Texas and the City incurs no liability for operation should funds not be appropriated by the State. At the September 20, 2010 Work Session, Council considered authorizing the City Manager to accept a Technical Assistance Negotiated Grant in the amount of \$82,325 for administration of the program, including \$3,920 indirect costs as City revenues.

ITEMS FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

Speaker Regulations:

Anyone wishing to speak for, against, or on agenda items must fill out a speaker card and give it to the City Secretary before speaking (cards located at the entrance to the Council Chambers). The Mayor will recognize speakers; he may impose a time limit and may provide for rebuttal. All comments and testimony are to be presented from the podium.

9. Hold a public hearing on the following zoning case:

Consider the application of Vicente de Jesus, requesting approval of 1) a change in zoning from Multi-Family (MF-18) District to Commercial-2 (C-2) District and 2) a Specific Use Permit for Contractor Equipment and Storage. The property is located at 3128 Denton Drive. (File 10-27)

This proposal is for approval of a change in zoning from Multi-Family (MF-18) to Commercial-2 (C-2) and a Specific Use Permit for Contractor Equipment and Storage. At the September 13, 2010 meeting, the Plan Commission (by a 9 to 0 vote) recommended approval for a period of 10 years tied to Vicente de Jesus as recommended by staff.

10. Consider appointments to Boards and Commissions.

Board members are selected for two-year terms by the City Council in August.

Terms are usually staggered whereby at least half of the membership has board experience. Board members are appointed based on qualifications.

11. Citizen comments.

Persons wishing to address issues not on the agenda may have three minutes to address Council at this time. Council is prohibited from discussing any item not posted according to the Texas Opens Meetings Act.

12. Adjourn.
