This request is for the construction of Cell #5 for waste disposal at the Charles M. Hinton, Jr. Landfill. In addition, a stormwater channel, access road, truck pad, and installation of a gas probe GP-12 will be included in this project.

e. Miller Road Substation Construction Labor Bid No. 499-09

MasTec North American, Inc.

This request is to provide labor necessary to construct the Miller Road 138 kV Substation.

f. Apollo Pump Station Backup Generator Repair Bid No. 546-09

Holt Cat

\$109,347.39

This request is to provide all labor and materials necessary to repair the standby generator that is required by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality to provide an uninterrupted supply of potable water in the event of power disruptions.

3. A public hearing was previously conducted for the following zoning case. Council approved the request and instructed staff to bring forth the following ordinance for consideration.

Zoning File No. 09-35, Charlie Shearer

Approval of an ordinance will approve an amendment to Planned Development (PD) District 07-59 for General Business Uses regarding signage on a 1.00-acre tract located south of West Avenue D and east of South Glenbrook Drive. 4. Consider a resolution authorizing the Director of Environmental Waste Services to file a project application with the North Central Texas Council of Governments for grant funding for a Regional Solid Waste Program Local Implementation Project.

At the October 5, 2009 Work Session, Council considered a request to authorize Environmental Waste Services to submit a grant proposal in the amount of \$57,745 to the North Central Texas Council of Governments to acquire grant funds to implement a standardized single stream workplace recycling program for all City of Garland facilities.

5. Consider an ordinance amending Chapter 30, "Building Inspection," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland.

At the October 5, 2009 Work Session, Council considered a proposed ordinance amending Article VIII, "Temporary Public Amusements and Temporary Activities," of Chapter 30, "Building Inspections," of the Code of Ordinances relating to temporary public amusements, such as carnivals, circuses, and other traveling or itinerant commercial public amusements and relating to temporary commercial activities including Christmas tree lots and other seasonal activities.

6. Consider by minute action authorizing the City Manager to execute Change Order No. 2 to Hill & Wilkinson, Ltd. in the amount of \$214,435.

At the October 5, 2009 Work Session, Council considered authorizing the issuance of Change Order No. 2 in the amount of \$214,435 to the general construction contract with Hill & Wilkinson, Ltd. for labor and materials necessary to house Marketing and QSE staff at the Utility Services Building.

7. Consider an ordinance amending Section 50.35, "Sewer Service Rates," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland by establishing a wastewater treatment rate for certain classes of customers.

At the October 5, 2009 Work Session, Council considered authorizing wastewater rate adjustments for the major industrial customers and customer cities rate classes. The methodology used for annually adjusting these rates is a routine process authorized in Section 50.35 of the Code of Ordinances.

8. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into a contract with the Texas State Library and Archives Commission to operate the Northeast Texas Library System (NETLS); to submit annually a grant application and program of service to operate NETLS.

The City of Garland contracts annually with the Texas State Library and Archives Commission to operate the Northeast Texas Library System (NETLS). At the October 5, 2009 Work Session, Council considered authorizing the approval of the State Fiscal Year 2010 NETLS Operating Grant Contract. The City will receive \$644,327 for operation of the NETLS service program through the Nicholson Memorial Library System during State Fiscal Year 2010 (September 1, 2009 through August 31, 2010), including a projected \$32,255 in indirect costs as City revenues.

9. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute and administer a grant with the Texas State Library and Archives Commission; providing that the Nicholson Memorial Library will provide certain services.

The City of Garland contracts with the Texas State Library and Archives Commission to administer the program for the Northeast Texas Library System through the Nicholson Memorial Library System. The program is fully funded by the State of Texas and the City incurs no liability for operation should funds not be appropriated by the State. At the October 5, 2009 Work Session, Council considered authorizing the City Manager to accept a Technical Assistance Negotiated Grant in the amount of \$81,110 for administration of the program. The City will receive \$3,862 in indirect costs as City revenues.

10. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a lease agreement with Clear Wireless LLC.

At the October 5, 2009 Work Session, Council considered a request by Clear Wireless LLC for a 10' x 10' ground lease at the rear of the South Garland Branch Library site at 4845 Broadway Boulevard for wireless communication equipment to serve an antenna to be placed on an existing TXU electrical power pole located on the property. The City will receive a lease payment of \$7,000 annually.

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ITEMS FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

Speaker Regulations:

- 11. Hold public hearings on the following zoning cases:
 - a. Consider the application of Hope, Hardwork, and Happiness Inc., requesting approval of a Specific Use Permit for Retail Sales with Gas Pumps on property zoned Industrial-1 (I-1) District. The property is located at 506 North First Street. (File 09-36)

The proposal is for approval of a Specific Use Permit for retail sales with gas pumps. At the September 28, 2009 meeting, the Plan Commission (by a 7 to 0 vote) recommended approval of a Specific Use Permit for retail sales with gas pumps for a period of 20 years tied to Hope, Hardwork, and Happiness, Inc. as recommended by staff.

b. Consider the application of Golden Max, Inc., requesting approval of a Specific Use Permit for a Convenience Store on property zoned Industrial-1 (I-1) District. The property is located at 3520 West Kingsley Road. (File 09-37)

The proposal is for approval of a Specific Use Permit for a convenience store. At the September 28, 2009 meeting, the Plan Commission (by a 6 to 1 vote) recommended approval of a Specific Use Permit for a Convenience Store for a period of 20 years tied to Golden Max, Inc. as recommended by staff.

12. Consider appointments to Boards and Commissions.

Board members are selected for two-year terms by the City Council in August. Terms are usually staggered whereby at least half of the membership has board experience. Board members are appointed based on qualifications.

13. Citizen comments.

Persons wishing to address issues not on the agenda may have three minutes to address Council at this time. Council is prohibited from discussing any item not posted according to the Texas Opens Meetings Act.

14. Adjourn.
