- 2. Consider approval of the following bids:

3. A public hearing was previously conducted for the following zoning case. Council approved the request and instructed staff to bring forth the following ordinance for consideration.

Zoning File No. 09-10, L. J. Erickson

Approval of an ordinance will approve a Specific Use Permit for a Car Wash (Unattended) on a 0.85-acre tract of land zoned Planned Development (PD) District 08-52 for Shopping Center Uses located at 3120 Kingsley Road.

4. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to sign an interlocal governmental agreement by and between the City of Garland and the City of Dallas relating to the Dallas Internet Crimes Against Children Taskforce Project.

At the April 6, 2009 Work Session, Council was scheduled to consider authorizing the Police Department to participate in the Dallas Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Taskforce. This taskforce would facilitate supplemental funding for the Garland Police Department's Internet Crimes Against Children Unit.

5. Consider an ordinance amending various sections of Chapter 51, "General Utility Provisions," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland.

At the March 23, 2009 Work Session, Council considered amending the Drought Contingency Plan and Water Conservation Plan to provide updated responses for the Garland Water Utilities to implement in times of drought or emergency, and to provide measures for implementing efficient water practices in order to maintain supplies for domestic water use, sanitation and fire protection, and minimize the adverse impacts of a water supply shortage. The update of both plans is required by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality by May 1, 2009 and every five years after that. City Council Agenda April 7, 2009 Page 4

6. Consider by minute action authorizing the City Manager to execute a design contract with R-Delta Engineers, Inc.

The reconstruction of Briarwood Drive between Duck Creek and Fifth Street as a concrete street with sidewalks is included in the Street Department's current multi-year infrastructure construction program. The complexity of this project, which replaces the existing asphalt street with concrete and includes the replacement of water and sanitary sewer mains and the installation of subsurface drainage structures, necessitates the hiring of a consultant design engineer. Staff has negotiated a design contract with R-Delta Engineers, Inc. in an estimated amount of \$144,600 to prepare the plans and specifications for this project.

Consider a resolution accepting a Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) – "Click It or Ticket" (CIOT) Grant in the amount of \$39,965.00.

At the April 6, 2009 Work Session, Council was scheduled to consider authorizing the acceptance of a TxDOT – Selective Traffic Enforcement Program Grant –"Click It or Ticket." The purpose of this grant is to save lives by conducting intense occupant protection enforcement as well as public information and education efforts during the 2009 Memorial Day holiday period, May 11, 2009 – May 31, 2009.

8. Consider a resolution approving and funding the 2008 Neighborhood Vitality Matching Grant Applications.

At the March 23, 2009 Work Session, Council considered approving and funding the 2008 Neighborhood Vitality Matching Grant applications for the first application cycle.

Speaker Regulations:

Anyone wishing to speak for, against, or on agenda items must fill out a speaker card and give it to the City Secretary before speaking (cards located at the entrance to the Council Chambers). The Mayor will recognize speakers; he may impose a time limit and may provide for rebuttal. All comments and testimony are to be presented from the podium. The City Attorney will swear in everyone who intends to present comments or testimony during the meeting.

9. Hold a public hearing to consider the 2009/2010 CDBG, HOME, and ESG Budget.

One of the requirements in the process of formulating the budget for the Federal Grants is to hold a public hearing. This hearing is to provide an opportunity for comments by any interested individual regarding the proposed use of the funds.

10. Hold a public hearing on the following zoning case:

Consider the application of the City of Garland to consider appropriate zoning on properties zoned Shopping Center (SC) District. These properties are bound by Belt Line Road, Century Park Drive and West Brand Road. (File 08-56)

The proposal is for approval of a change of zoning on property zoned for Shopping Center Uses. At the February 9, 2009 meeting, the Plan Commission (by an 8 to 0 vote) recommended approval of the request as recommended by staff.

11. Citizen comments.

Persons wishing to address issues not on the agenda may have three minutes to address Council at this time. Council is prohibited from discussing any item not posted according to the Texas Opens Meetings Act.

12. Adjourn.
