CONSENT AGENDA

- 1. Consider approval of the minutes of the August 14, 2012 Special Meeting and August 21, 2012 Regular Meeting.
- 2. Consider approval of the following bids:
 - a. One-Ton Trucks Bid No. 3032-12
 - Randall Reed's Prestige Ford \$159,877.00

This request is for the purchase of four one-ton replacement trucks for various departments to be used in daily operations.

- b. Overhead Maintenance and Construction Bid No. 3045-12
 - T & D Solutions \$500,000.00

This request is to provide all labor and equipment necessary to remove and replace electric overhead facilities for maintenance or construction purposes for Garland Power & Light.

c. Upgrade Turbine Supervisory System Bid No. 3047-12

Metrix Instrument Company \$110,075.00

This request is for the upgrade of the Turbine Supervisory System (TSI) at Ray Olinger Unit 3 Turbine. The current TSI is unreliable and repair parts are no longer available.

d. Replacement of Cisco Network Equipment Bid No. 3094-12

INX, Inc.

\$243,674.86

This request is for the purchase of the necessary Cisco network equipment to support the replacement of aging network routers and switches at various locations in the City.

3. Public hearings were previously conducted for the following zoning cases. Council approved the requests and instructed staff to bring forth the following ordinances for consideration.

a. Zoning File No. 12-34, Illiana Rojas

Consider an ordinance amending the zoning laws of the City of Garland by approving a Specific Use Permit for a Reception Facility on property zoned Industrial 1 (I-1) on a 6.803-acre tract located at 2800 West Kingsley Road, Suites 100 and 101.

b. Zoning File No. 12-37, Provence @ Firewheel

Consider an ordinance amending the zoning laws of the City of Garland by approving an amendment to Planned Development (PD) District 04-19 for Single Family Uses regarding regulation of garages on thirteen lots not served by an alley on a 138.51-acre tract of land known as Provence @ Firewheel located west of Lavon Drive/SH 78, southeast of Talley Road, and east of Brand Road.

4. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute an engineering services agreement with R-Delta Engineers, Inc.

The engineering services agreement with R-Delta Engineers, Inc. is for completing the limited topographic surveying and mapping, electrical engineering, civil engineering, structural engineering, and municipal planning and permitting coordination necessary to expand Rosehill Substation for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$106,000 (includes \$10,320 contingency for unforeseen design requirements).

5. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute an engineering services agreement with R-Delta Engineers, Inc.

The engineering services agreement with R-Delta Engineers, Inc. is for completing the topographic surveying and mapping, electrical engineering, civil engineering, structural engineering, geotechnical engineering, landscape architecture, landscape irrigation design, and municipal planning and permitting coordination necessary to demolish and reconstruct Wynn Joyce Substation for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$354,000 (includes \$32,240 contingency for unforeseen design requirements).

6. Consider an ordinance amending the tax roll of the City of Garland.

Council annually amends the tax roll to reflect uncollected ad valorem taxes. Amendment of the tax roll is necessary to meet generally accepted accounting principles, avoid overstatement of accounts receivable on the balance sheet and avoid risk of a qualified audit opinion from the external auditors. Although the tax roll is reduced by this action, collection efforts continue unless the costs of those efforts exceed potential revenues. This item was considered by Council at the August 20, 2012 Work Session.

Consider a resolution accepting a Texas Department of Transportation Selective Traffic Enforcement Program – Single Year – 2013 Comprehensive Grant in the amount of \$507,651.97.

At the September 4, 2012 Work Session, Council was requested to consider authorizing the acceptance of a Texas Department of Transportation – Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) – Comprehensive Grant to be used to save lives, reduce motor vehicle crashes and injuries, and change behavior related to driving habits. This will be accomplished by aggressively enforcing the laws of the State of Texas related to (1) red light and intersection violations, (2) seat belt violations, (3) speed violations, and (4) driving while intoxicated violations. ITEMS FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

Speaker Regulations:

Anyone wishing to speak for, against, or on agenda items must fill out a speaker card and give it to the City Secretary before speaking (cards located at the entrance to the Council Chambers). The Mayor will recognize speakers; he may impose a time limit and may provide for rebuttal. All comments and testimony are to be presented from the podium.

8. Hold a public hearing regarding the 2012-13 Proposed Budget and Tax Rate.

Section 5, Article VII, of the City Charter requires that a public hearing be held on the Proposed Budget for the coming fiscal year. At the public hearing, all interested persons shall be given an opportunity to be heard for or against any proposed item in the Budget, including the proposed tax rate. The Proposed Budget for 2012-13 has been available for public inspection in the City libraries, in the City Secretary's Office, and on the City's website since August 8, 2012.

9. Consider an ordinance adopting the operating budget for fiscal year 2012-13, providing budgetary appropriations for the various funds of the City, amending the current budget as revised, authorizing the City Manager to make adjustments.

In accordance with the City Charter, the City Manager presented his recommended Budget for fiscal year 2012-13 to the Council on August 7, 2012. Copies were made available for public inspection at City libraries, at the City Secretary's Office, and on the City's website. Public hearings were held on August 21 and 30, 2012.

10. Consider an ordinance fixing the tax rate and tax levy for the City of Garland for the fiscal year 2012-13 upon all taxable property in the City of Garland in conformity with the laws of the State of Texas and the

Charter provisions and ordinances of the City of Garland; repealing all ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict therewith.

Council has considered an ad valorem tax rate of 70.46 cents per \$100 of valuation for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2012. All meetings, notices, and public hearing requirements related to the adoption of the tax rate have been met in accordance with State law. Public hearings were held on the proposed tax rate on August 21 and 30, 2012.

11. Consider an ordinance amending various sections of Section 50, "Utility Rates and Fees" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, relating to fees charged for various services provided by the City.

In considering the 2012-13 Proposed Budget, Council reviewed the creation of certain rates and fees, and adjustments to existing rates and fees. Revenue estimates included in the 2012-13 Proposed Budget are based on these actions.

12. Consider an ordinance establishing Civil Service classifications within the Police and Fire Departments; prescribing the number of positions in each classification; prescribing the base salary and types of pay for those classifications.

Pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 143 of the Local Government Code of Texas, the Council must establish the civil service classifications in the Police and Fire Departments, the number of positions in each classification, the base salary, and the types of incentive pays for each classification.

13. Hold a public hearing to consider the application of Oscar Heydari, requesting approval of a variance to Section XII.4 of the Downtown Development Standards regarding required parking lot landscaping on property zoned Commercial (C-2) District. The property is located at 119 Main Street. (File DD 12-01)

The proposal is for approval of a variance to the Downtown Development Standards requiring a minimum of 5% of the parking area to be landscaped and one large tree for every ten parking spaces. At the August 13, 2012 meeting, the Plan Commission (by an 8 to 1 vote) recommended approval of the variance as requested by the applicant. City Council Agenda September 4, 2012 Page 7

- 14. Hold public hearings on the following zoning cases:
 - a. Consider the application of Tiffany Enriquez requesting approval of a Specific Use Permit for Child Care Center on property zoned Planned Development (PD) 78-87 District for Retail Uses. The property is located at 2121 Northwest Highway, Suites 116 and 117. (File 12-38)

The proposal is for approval of a Specific Use Permit for a Child Care Center on property zoned Planned Development 78-87. At the August 13, 2012 meeting, the Plan Commission (by a 9 to 0 vote) recommended approval of the Specific Use Permit for a period of 10 years tied to Tiffany Enriquez, as recommended by staff.

b. Consider the application of Cornerstone United Methodist Church requesting approval of a Specific Use Permit for Child Care Center on property zoned Agriculture (AG) District. The property is located at 7502 North Garland Avenue. (File 12-39)

The proposal is for approval of a Specific Use Permit for a Child Care Center on property zoned Agriculture and the site of a church. At the August 13, 2012 meeting, the Plan Commission (by a 9 to 0 vote) recommended approval of the Specific Use Permit for a period of 20 years tied to Cornerstone United Methodist Church as recommended by staff.

15. Consider appointments to Boards and Commissions.

Board members are selected for two-year terms by the City Council in August. Terms are usually staggered whereby at least half of the membership has board experience. Board members are appointed based on qualifications.



This Engineering Services Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered by and between the City of Garland, Texas, (the "City") a home rule municipality with an electric department operating an electric system (the "System") known as Garland Power & Light ("GP&L") and **R-Delta Engineers, Inc.** ("Engineer").

Section 1. <u>Engineering Agreement</u> - <u>Scope of Work</u>.

The City retains Engineer to provide surveying, limited topographic surveying mapping, municipal & planning and permitting coordination, and engineering services necessary for improvements consisting of the expansion of the existing Rosehill Substation ring bus to accommodate a transformer additional new and distribution feeders for a fixed fee of **\$95,680.00** amount per the attached R-Delta Engineers, Inc. Proposal dated August 21, 2012.

The substation expansion will generally include the following: one 138kV circuit breaker, three (3) 138kV gang operated switches, one 3-phase 138kV-15kV transformer (existing WEG), one 34kV switch, one 15kv metal enclosed switchgear, new buswork, modification existing buswork. additional of lightning shielding. ground grid expansion, modification of existing feeder duct lines, and construction of three new distribution feeder duct lines.

Section 2. <u>Services to be Provided;</u> <u>Responsibilities of Parties.</u>

(A) Unless expressly limited or excluded by the Scope of Work, Engineer shall provide, at a minimum, the following services and have the following responsibilities in connection with each Scope of Work approved by the City. In that connection, the Engineer shall:

(1) See the attached R-Delta Engineers, Inc. proposal dated August 21, 2012.

(2) Determine what, if any, additional engineering or drawings are required.

(3) Commence work under the scope of Work no more than fourteen (14) days of after receipt of notice to proceed from the City.

(B) City shall:

(1) Provide such pertinent details and information as may be within the possession of the City to the Engineer in the performance of the requested Scope of Work.

(2) Provide assistance and input as required at appropriate times in order for the Engineer to complete tasks as assigned.

Section 3. <u>Compensation</u>.

(A) *Basic Services:* The City shall pay Engineer only in accordance with the rates and the not-to-exceed limitations contained in the Scope of Work on a time and materials basis. The City shall not be obligated to pay Engineer for any services, expenses, reimbursables, or other costs in excess of the not-to-exceed amount specified in the Scope of Work unless Engineer has obtained the express, written consent of the City prior to the commencement of services or incurring expenses claimed. Unless the otherwise provided in the Scope of Work, the anticipated submittal of all Project deliverables is immediately upon completion of the Project.

The total cost of this Agreement is for a **total fixed cost of NINETY-FIVE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED EIGHTY DOLLARS (\$95,680.00)** without further discussion/approvals of City (GP&L) staff. Any revisions to work after commencement of engineering design necessitated by changes will be per Section 4 and the Engineer's hourly published rates dated August 2012.

The Total Agreement is comprised of the following:

Offsite Duct Line Design:	\$ 11,200.
Estimated costs):	<u>\$ 300.</u>
Fixed Fee Amount:	\$ 95,680.
CONTINGENCY Amount:	\$ <u>10,320.</u>
Total Agreement Amount:	\$106,000.

<u>CONTINGENCY</u>: Contingency amount is for unforeseen changes of services necessary to complete the project, and is to be authorized at the sole discretion of the City (GP&L).

The "CONTINGENCY" expenditures must be approved in writing by City (GP&L) staff prior to starting that work.

(B) *Billing Period:* The Engineer may submit monthly, or less frequent, an

invoice for payment based on the estimated completion of the described tasks and approved work schedule. Engineer shall reference the "Scope of Work" number (e.g. COG111) on each invoice submitted to GP&L for payment. Subject to Chapter 2251, Texas Code (the "Prompt Government Payment Act") payment is due within thirty (30) days of the City's receipt of the invoice. Interest on overdue shall payments be calculated in accordance with the Prompt Payment Act. [NOTE: Engineer shall notify GP&L, in writing, when ninety percent (90%) of the total not-toexceed amount has been invoiced.]

(C)*Reimbursable Expenses:* City agrees to pay the actual, necessary and reasonable expenses incurred bv Engineer in performing services under Agreement, or this to reimburse Engineer for such expenses, as the case may be, for those expenses that the City has given prior approval such as long distance telephone and fax. postage and courier costs, copying costs, out-of-area travel, and related business expenses (such expenses not to exceed \$100.00 without the prior approval of the City).

Special Services: Compensation (D) for "special services" shall be based on the Engineer's established hourly rates which shall be stated in or attached to the Scope of Work. Statements for special services may only be submitted on a monthly basis. Engineer shall advise the City in advance if the Engineer contends that a particular service falls into the "special services" service shall category. No be compensated as a special service unless and until approved by the City. The

City shall promptly determine whether a service constitutes a special service so that work shall not be unreasonably delayed. As used in this Agreement, the term "special services" means:

(1) Preparation of any special reports required for the marketing of bonds or certificates of obligation.

(2) Appearances before regulatory agencies other than the City.

(3) Assistance to the City as an expert witness in any litigation with third parties arising from the development or construction of the Project and not involving the alleged fault of the Engineer.

(4) Special investigations involving detailed consideration of operation, maintenance and overhead expenses; preparation of rate schedules, earnings, and expense statements: preparation of special feasibility studies. appraisals, valuations, and material audits or inventories required for certification of force account construction performed by the City.

(5) Detailed mill, shop, and laboratory inspection of materials or equipment.

(6) Preparation of estimates and engineer's rolls necessary for special assessments.

(7) Additional copies of reports and specifications (over the agreed number specified in the Scope of Work) and additional blueprint copies of drawings (over the agreed number specified in the Scope of Work). (8) Preparation of applications and supporting documents for government grants or planning advances for public works projects.

(9) Preparation of environmental statements and assistance to the City in preparing for and attending public hearings on environmental impact statements.

(E) Records of Expenses: Engineer shall maintain reasonably detailed records of all work done on behalf of the City under this Agreement (and any Scope of Work issued pursuant to this Agreement) and of all expenses incurred for which Engineer seeks payment or reimbursement. Engineer shall promptly provide such records to the City upon request for inspection, copying, and audit.

Section 4. <u>Changes to the Project</u> <u>Work; Additional Work</u>.

(A) Changes to Work: Engineer shall make such revisions to any work that has been completed as are necessary to correct any errors or omissions as may appear in such work. If the City finds it necessary to make changes to previously satisfactorily completed work or parts thereof, the Engineer shall make such revisions if requested and as directed by the City and such services will be considered as additional work and paid for as specified under following paragraph.

(B) Additional Work: Work that is clearly not within the general description of the Scope of Work and does not otherwise constitute special services under this Agreement must be

approved in writing by the City by supplemental agreement before the additional work is undertaken by the If the Engineer is of the Engineer. opinion that any work is beyond that contemplated in this Agreement and the Scope of Work governing the project and therefore constitutes additional work, the Engineer shall promptly notify the City of that opinion, in writing. If the City agrees that such work does constitute additional work, then the City and the Engineer shall execute a supplemental agreement for the additional work and the City shall compensate the Engineer for the additional work on the basis of the rates contained in the Scope of Work. The not-to-exceed fee shall be adjusted if additional work is approved by the City and performed by the Engineer.

Section 5. <u>Time of Completion</u>.

The prompt completion of the Project to which a Scope of Work relates is critical to the reliability and functionality of the System and is of the essence to the performance of this Agreement. Unnecessary delays in providing services under a Scope of Work shall be grounds for dismissal of the Engineer and termination of this Agreement without any or further liability to the City other than a prorated payment for necessary, timely, and conforming work done by Engineer prior to the time of termination. The Scope of Work shall provide, in either calendar days or by providing a final date, a time of completion prior to which the Engineer shall have completed all tasks and services described in the Scope of Work.

<u>SCHEDULE:</u> As outlined in the

attached Proposal dated August 21, 2012 Engineer proposes a project design schedule of seventy (70) calendar days with early release of switchgear specifications, structural steel, foundations, and other project components to meet the City's (GP&L) construction scheduling requirements.

Section 6. <u>Professional Liability</u> <u>Insurance</u>.

Before commencing work under any Scope of Work, Engineer shall obtain, and furnish to the City evidence of. standard comprehensive professional liability insurance coverage in an amount of at least \$1,000,000.00 aggregate per year, covering the services provided under this Engineer shall maintain Agreement. such coverage during all phases of work provided under this Agreement and for a period of at least one (1) year after substantial completion of the Scope of Work. The City shall be issued a certificate of coverage that shall provide for a thirty (30) day notice to the City, by certified or registered mail, of cancellation, non-renewal or material alteration in the stated provisions of the policy.

Section 7. <u>Dispute Resolution.</u>

In accordance with the provisions of Subchapter I, Chapter 271, Texas Local Government Code, the parties agree that, prior to instituting any lawsuit or other proceeding arising from a dispute under this Agreement, the parties will first attempt to resolve the dispute by taking the following steps: (i) A written notice substantially describing the nature of the dispute shall be delivered by the dissatisfied party to the other party, which notice shall request a written response to be delivered to the dissatisfied party not less than 5 days after receipt of the notice of dispute; (ii) If the response does not reasonably resolve the dispute, in the opinion of the dissatisfied party, the dissatisfied party shall give notice to that effect to the other party whereupon each party shall appoint a person having authority over the activities of the respective parties who shall promptly meet, in person, in an effort to resolve the dispute; (iii) If those persons cannot or do not resolve the dispute, then the parties shall each appoint a person from the highest tier of managerial responsibility within each respective party, who shall then promptly meet, in person, in an effort to resolve the dispute.

Section 8. <u>Miscellaneous Provisions</u>.

(A) *Subletting.* The Engineer shall not sublet or transfer any portion of the work under this Agreement or any Scope of Work issued pursuant to this Agreement unless specifically approved in writing by the City, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. Subcontractors shall comply with all provisions of this Agreement and the applicable Scope of Work. The approval or acquiescence of the City in the subletting of any work shall not relieve the Engineer of any responsibility for work done by such subcontractor.

(B) Ownership of Documents. Upon completion or termination of this Agreement, all documents prepared by the Engineer or furnished to the Engineer by the City shall be delivered to and become the property of the City. All drawings, charts, calculations,

plans, specifications and other data prepared under or pursuant to this Agreement shall be made available, upon request, to the City without restriction or limitation on the further use of such materials PROVIDED. HOWEVER, THAT SUCH MATERIALS ARE NOT INTENDED OR REPRESENTED TO BE SUITABLE FOR REUSE BY THE CITY OR OTHERS. ANY REUSE WITHOUT PRIOR VERIFICATION OR ADAPTATION BY THE ENGINEER FOR THE SPECIFIC PURPOSE INTENDED WILL BE AT THE CITY'S SOLE RISK AND WITHOUT LIABILITY TO THE ENGINEER. Where applicable, Engineer shall retain all pre-existing proprietary rights in the materials provided to the City but shall grant to the City a non-exclusive, perpetual, royalty-free license to use such proprietary information solely for the purposes for which the information was provided. The Engineer may, at Engineer's expense, have copies made of the documents or any other data furnished to the City under or pursuant to this Agreement.

(C) Engineer's Seal. The Engineer shall place the Texas Professional Engineer's seal of endorsement of the principal engineer on all documents and engineering data furnished by the Engineer to the City. All work and services provided under this Agreement will be performed in a good and workmanlike fashion and shall conform to the accepted standards and practices of the engineering profession. The plans, specifications and engineering data provided by Engineer shall be adequate and sufficient to enable those performing the actual construction of the work to perform the work as and within the time contemplated by the

and City Engineer. The Citv acknowledges that Engineer has no control over the methods or means of construction nor the costs of labor, equipment. Unless materials or otherwise agreed in writing, anv estimates of construction costs by the Engineer are for informational purposes only and are not guarantees.

(D) Compliance with Laws. The Engineer shall comply with all federal, state and local laws. statutes. ordinances, rules and regulations, and the orders and decrees of any courts, administrative, or regulatory bodies in any matter affecting the performance of this Agreement, including, without limitation, worker's compensation laws, minimum and maximum salary and wage statutes and regulations, and licensing laws and regulations. When required, the Engineer shall furnish the with satisfactory proof City of compliance.

(E) Independent Contractor. Engineer acknowledges that Engineer is an independent contractor of the City and is not an employee, agent, official or representative of the City. Engineer shall not represent, either expressly or through implication, that Engineer is employee, agent, official or an representative of the City. Income taxes, self-employment taxes, social security taxes and the like are the sole responsibility of the Engineer.

(F) Non-Collusion. Engineer represents and warrants that Engineer has not given, made, promised or paid, nor offered to give, make, promise or pay any gift, bonus, commission, money or other consideration to any person as an inducement to or in order to obtain the

work to be provided to the City under this Agreement. Engineer further agrees that Engineer shall not accept any gift, bonus, commission, money, or other consideration from any person (other than from the City under or pursuant to this Agreement) for any of the services performed by Engineer under or related to this Agreement. If any such gift, bonus, commission, money, or other consideration is received by or offered to Engineer, Engineer shall immediately report that fact to the City and, at the sole option of the City, the City may elect to accept the consideration for itself or to take the value of such consideration as a credit against the compensation otherwise owing to Engineer under or pursuant to this Agreement.

(G) Force Majeure. If the performance of any covenant or obligation to be performed hereunder by any party is delayed as a result of circumstances which are beyond the reasonable control of such party (which circumstances may include, without limitation, pending litigation, acts of God, war, acts of civil disobedience, fire or other casualty, shortage of materials, adverse weather conditions [such as, by way of illustration and not of limitation, severe rain storms or below freezing temperatures, or tornados] labor action, strikes or similar acts, moratoriums or regulations or actions by governmental authorities). the time for such performance shall be extended by the amount of time of such delay, but no longer than the amount of time reasonably occasioned by the delay. party claiming delav of The performance as a result of any of the foregoing "force majeure" events shall deliver written notice of the

commencement of any such delay resulting from such force majeure event not later than seven (7) days after the claiming party becomes aware of the same, and if the claiming party fails to so notify the other party of the occurrence of a "force majeure" event causing such delay and the other party shall not otherwise be aware of such "force majeure" event, the claiming party shall not be entitled to avail itself of the provisions for the extension of performance contained in this subsection.

Section 9. <u>Termination.</u>

(A) This Agreement (which shall include any Scope of Work issued pursuant to this Agreement) may be terminated:

(1) By the mutual agreement and consent of both Engineer and City;

(2) By either party, upon the failure of the other party to fulfill its obligations as set forth in either this Agreement or a Scope of Work issued under this Agreement;

(3) By the City, immediately upon notice in writing to the Engineer, as consequence of the failure of Engineer to perform the services contemplated by this Agreement in a timely or satisfactory manner;

(4) By the City, at will and without cause upon not less than thirty(30) days written notice to the Engineer.

(B) If the City terminates this Agreement pursuant to Section 5 or subsection 8(A)(2) or (3), above, the Engineer shall not be entitled to any

fees or reimbursable expenses other than the fees and reimbursable expenses then due and payable as of the time of termination and only then for those services that have been timely and adequately performed by the Engineer considering the actual costs incurred by the Engineer in performing work to date of termination, the value of the work that is nonetheless usable to the City, the cost to the City of employing another engineer to complete the work required and the time required to do so, and other factors that affect the value to the City of the work performed at time of termination. In the event of termination not the fault of the Engineer, the Engineer shall be compensated for all basic, special, and additional services actually performed prior to termination, together with any reimbursable expenses then due.

Section 10. Indemnification. Engineer agrees to indemnify and hold the City of Garland, Texas and all of its present, future and former agents, employees, officials and representatives harmless in their official, individual and representative capacities from any and all claims, causes demands. of action. judgments. liens and expenses (including attorney's fees, whether contractual or statutory), costs and damages (whether common law or statutory). costs and damages (whether common law or statutory, and whether actual, punitive, consequential or incidental), of any conceivable character, for injuries to persons (including death) or to property (both real and personal) created by, arising from or in any manner relating to the services or goods performed or provided by

Engineer – expressly including those arising through strict liability or under the constitutions of the United States or Texas – BUT ONLY TO THE EXTENT ALLOWABLE BY SEC. 271.904(a) OF THE TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE.

Section 11. Notices. Any notice required or desired to be given from one party to the other party to this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be given and shall be deemed to have been served and received (whether actually received or not) if (i) delivered in person to the address set forth below; (ii) deposited in an official depository under the regular care and custody of the United States Postal Service located within the confines of the United States of America and sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, and addressed to such party at the address hereinafter specified; or (iii) delivered to such party by courier receipted delivery. Either party may designate another address within the confines of the continental United States of America for notice, but until written notice of such change is actually received by the other party, the last address of such party designated for notice shall remain such party's address for notice.

Section 12. <u>No Assignment</u>. Neither party shall have the right to assign that party's interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.

Section 13. <u>Severability</u>. If any term or provision of this Agreement is held to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, the legality, validity or enforceability of the remaining terms or provisions of this

Agreement shall not be affected thereby, and in lieu of each such illegal, invalid or unenforceable term or provision, there shall be added automatically to this Agreement a legal, valid or enforceable term or provision as similar as possible to the term or provision declared illegal, invalid or unenforceable.

Section 14. Waiver. Either City or the Engineer shall have the right to waive any requirement contained in this Agreement that is intended for the waiving party's benefit, but, except as otherwise provided herein, such waiver shall be effective only if in writing executed by the party for whose benefit such requirement is intended. No waiver of any breach or violation of any term of this Agreement shall be deemed or construed to constitute a waiver of any other breach or violation, whether concurrent or subsequent, and whether of the same or of a different type of breach or violation.

Section 15. Governing Law; Venue. This Agreement and all of the transactions contemplated herein shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. The provisions and obligations of this Agreement are performable in Dallas County, Texas such that exclusive venue for any action arising out of this Agreement shall be in Dallas County, Texas.

Section 16. <u>Paragraph Headings;</u> <u>Construction</u>. The paragraph headings contained in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall in no way enlarge or limit the scope or meaning of the various and several paragraphs hereof. Both parties have participated in the negotiation and preparation of this Agreement and this Agreement shall not be construed either more or less strongly against or for either party.

Section 17. <u>Binding Effect</u>. Except as limited herein, the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, devisees, personal and legal representatives, successors and assigns.

Section 18. <u>Gender</u>. Within this Agreement, words of any gender shall be held and construed to include any other gender, and words in the singular number shall be held and construed to include the plural, unless the context otherwise requires.

Section 19. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

Section 20. <u>Exhibits</u>. All exhibits to this Agreement are incorporated herein by reference for all purposes wherever reference is made to the same.

Section 21. Entire Agreement. It is understood and agreed that this Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior any and agreements, arrangements or understandings between the parties relating to the subject matter. No oral understandings, statements, promises or inducements contrary to the terms of this Agreement exist. This Agreement

cannot be changed or terminated orally.

Section 22. Relationship of Parties. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed by the parties hereto or by any third party to create the relationship of principal and agent or of partnership or of joint venture or of anv association whatsoever between the parties, it being expressly understood and agreed that no provision contained in this Agreement nor any act or acts of the parties hereto shall be deemed to create any relationship between the parties other than the relationship of independent parties contracting with each other solely for the purpose of provisions effecting the of this Agreement.

Right To Audit. Section 23. City shall have the right to examine and audit after reasonable notice any and all books and records of Seller/Contractor that may relate to this agreement including, without limitation, the performance of Seller/Contractor, its employees. agents. and subcontractors. Such books and records will be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and shall, upon request and at City's request, be made available at a location designated by City. Seller/Contractor shall, except for copying costs, otherwise bear all costs of producing such records for examination and copying by City. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties, such records must be made available to City within five business days. The provisions of this paragraph shall survive the termination of this agreement. (Revised 11/2008)

Section 24. Nondisclosure. Engineer that reports, agrees any data, documentation or other information given to, prepared by or reviewed by Engineer or its employees and agents under or in connection with this Agreement mav be proprietary, competitive and confidential information of the City. Engineer shall make every reasonable effort to maintain the confidentiality of such information and shall not sell, license, display, distribute. disclose or otherwise make available such information to any third party nor use

such information except as authorized by this Agreement, upon written consent of City or unless authorized or required by law, court order, or pursuant to a subpoena; provided, however, that Engineer may not release information pursuant to a subpoena without first providing the City notice of the subpoena and a opportunity to contest (at the City's sole expense) the release of the information.

The City retains Engineer to provide topographic surveying, limited surveying & mapping, geotechnical engineering, landscape architecture, landscape irrigation design, and municipal planning and permitting coordination, and engineering services necessary for improvements of the existing Wynn Joyce Substation into a three ring bus configuration for a fixed fee of **\$321,760.00** amount per the attached R-Delta Engineers, Inc. Proposal dated August 21, 2012.

The substation demolition and reconstruction will generally include following: five 138kV circuit the (9) 138kV potential breaker, nine transformers, fifteen (15) 138kV gang operated switches, two 3-phase 138kV-15kV transformer (reuse existing), two 34kV switches, two 48v DC batteries and chargers, two DC panels, one AC two metal panel 15kv enclosed switchgear, and lightning shielding.

Section 2. <u>Services to be Provided;</u> <u>Responsibilities of Parties.</u>

(A) Unless expressly limited or

excluded by the Scope of Work, Engineer shall provide, at a minimum, the following services and have the following responsibilities in connection with each Scope of Work approved by the City. In that connection, the Engineer shall:

(1) See the attached R-Delta Engineers, Inc. proposal dated August 21, 2012.

(2) Determine what, if any, additional engineering or drawings are required.

(3) Commence work under the scope of Work no more than fourteen (14) days of after receipt of notice to proceed from the City.

(B) City shall:

(1) Provide such pertinent details and information as may be within the possession of the City to the Engineer in the performance of the requested Scope of Work.

(2) Provide assistance and input as required at appropriate times in order for the Engineer to complete tasks as assigned.

Section 3. <u>Compensation</u>.

(A) *Basic Services:* The City shall pay Engineer only in accordance with the rates and the not-to-exceed limitations contained in the Scope of Work on a time and materials basis. The City shall not be obligated to pay Engineer for any services, expenses, reimbursables, or other costs in excess of the not-to-exceed amount specified in the Scope of Work unless Engineer has obtained the express, written consent of the City prior to the commencement of services or incurring the expenses claimed. Unless otherwise provided in the Scope of Work, the anticipated submittal of all Project deliverables is immediately upon completion of the Project.

The total cost of this Agreement is for a total fixed cost of THREE HUNDRED **TWENTY-ONE** THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED SIXTY DOLLARS (\$321,760.00) without further discussion/approvals of City (GP&L) staff. Any revisions to work after commencement of engineering design necessitated by changes will be per Section 4 and the Engineer's hourly published rates dated August 2012.

The Total Agreement is comprised of the following:

Total Agreement Amount:	\$354,000.

<u>CONTINGENCY</u>: Contingency amount is for unforeseen changes of services necessary to complete the project, and is to be authorized at the sole discretion of the City (GP&L).

The "CONTINGENCY" expenditures must be approved in writing by City (GP&L) staff prior to starting that work.

(B)*Billing Period:* The Engineer may submit monthly, or less frequent, an invoice for payment based on the estimated completion of the described tasks and approved work schedule. Engineer shall reference the "Scope of Work" number (e.g. COG112) on each invoice submitted to GP&L for payment. Subject to Chapter 2251. Texas "Prompt (the Government Code Payment Act") payment is due within thirty (30) days of the City's receipt of the invoice. Interest on overdue be calculated payments shall in accordance with the Prompt Payment Act. [NOTE: Engineer shall notify GP&L, in writing, when ninety percent (90%) of the total not-toexceed amount has been invoiced.]

(C)*Reimbursable Expenses:* City agrees to pay the actual, necessary and reasonable expenses incurred bv Engineer in performing services under this Agreement, or to reimburse Engineer for such expenses, as the case may be, for those expenses that the City has given prior approval such as long distance telephone and fax. postage and courier costs, copying costs, out-of-area travel, and related business expenses (such expenses not to exceed \$100.00 without the prior approval of the City).

(D) Special Services: Compensation for "special services" shall be based on the Engineer's established hourly rates which shall be stated in or attached to the Scope of Work. Statements for special services may only be submitted on a monthly basis. Engineer shall advise the City in advance if the Engineer contends that a particular service falls into the "special services" category. No service shall be

compensated as a special service unless and until approved by the City. The City shall promptly determine whether a service constitutes a special service so that work shall not be unreasonably delayed. As used in this Agreement, the term "special services" means:

(1) Preparation of any special reports required for the marketing of bonds or certificates of obligation.

(2) Appearances before regulatory agencies other than the City.

(3) Assistance to the City as an expert witness in any litigation with third parties arising from the development or construction of the Project and not involving the alleged fault of the Engineer.

investigations (4) Special involving detailed consideration of operation, maintenance and overhead expenses; preparation of rate schedules. earnings, and expense preparation statements; of special feasibility studies. appraisals, valuations, and material audits or inventories required for certification of force account construction performed by the City.

(5) Detailed mill, shop, and laboratory inspection of materials or equipment.

(6) Preparation of estimates and engineer's rolls necessary for special assessments.

(7) Additional copies of reports and specifications (over the agreed number specified in the Scope of Work) and additional blueprint copies of drawings (over the agreed number specified in the Scope of Work).

(8) Preparation of applications and supporting documents for government grants or planning advances for public works projects.

(9) Preparation of environmental statements and assistance to the City in preparing for and attending public hearings on environmental impact statements.

(E) Records of Expenses: Engineer shall maintain reasonably detailed records of all work done on behalf of the City under this Agreement (and any Scope of Work issued pursuant to this of Agreement) and all expenses incurred for which Engineer seeks payment or reimbursement. Engineer shall promptly provide such records to the City upon request for inspection, copying, and audit.

Section 4. <u>Changes to the Project</u> <u>Work; Additional Work</u>.

(A) Changes to Work: Engineer shall make such revisions to any work that has been completed as are necessary to correct any errors or omissions as may appear in such work. If the City finds it necessarv to make changes to previously satisfactorily completed work or parts thereof, the Engineer shall make such revisions if requested and as directed by the City and such services will be considered as additional work and paid for as specified under following paragraph.

(B) Additional Work: Work that is clearly not within the general description of the Scope of Work and

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does not otherwise constitute special services under this Agreement must be approved in writing by the City by supplemental agreement before the additional work is undertaken by the Engineer. If the Engineer is of the opinion that any work is beyond that contemplated in this Agreement and the Scope of Work governing the project and therefore constitutes additional work, the Engineer shall promptly notify the City of that opinion, in writing. If the City agrees that such work does constitute additional work, then the City and the Engineer shall execute a supplemental agreement for the additional work and the City shall compensate the Engineer for the additional work on the basis of the rates contained in the Scope of Work. The not-to-exceed fee shall be adjusted if additional work is approved by the City and performed by the Engineer.

Section 5. <u>Time of Completion</u>.

The prompt completion of the Project to which a Scope of Work relates is critical to the reliability and functionality of the System and is of the essence to the performance of this Agreement. Unnecessary delays in providing services under a Scope of Work shall be grounds for dismissal of the Engineer and termination of this Agreement without any or further liability to the City other than a prorated payment for necessary, timely, and conforming work done by Engineer prior to the time of termination. The Scope of Work shall provide, in either calendar days or by providing a final date, a time of completion prior to which the Engineer shall have completed all tasks and services described in the Scope of Work.

<u>SCHEDULE:</u> As outlined in the attached Proposal dated August 21, 2012 Engineer proposes a project design schedule of two hundred (200) calendar days with early release of switchgear specifications, structural steel, foundations, and other project components to meet the City's (GP&L) construction scheduling requirements.

Section 6. <u>Professional Liability</u> <u>Insurance</u>.

Before commencing work under any Scope of Work, Engineer shall obtain, and furnish to the City evidence of. standard comprehensive professional liability insurance coverage in an amount of at least \$1,000,000.00 covering aggregate per year, the services provided under this Engineer shall maintain Agreement. such coverage during all phases of work provided under this Agreement and for a period of at least one (1) year after substantial completion of the Scope of The City shall be issued a Work. certificate of coverage that shall provide for a thirty (30) day notice to the City, by certified or registered mail, of cancellation, non-renewal or material alteration in the stated provisions of the policy.

Section 7. Dispute Resolution.

In accordance with the provisions of Subchapter I, Chapter 271, Texas Local Government Code, the parties agree that, prior to instituting any lawsuit or other proceeding arising from a dispute under this Agreement, the parties will first attempt to resolve the dispute by taking the following steps: (i) A written notice substantially describing the nature of the dispute shall be delivered by the dissatisfied party to the other party, which notice shall request a written response to be delivered to the dissatisfied party not less than 5 days after receipt of the notice of dispute; (ii) If the response does not reasonably resolve the dispute, in the opinion of the dissatisfied party, the dissatisfied party shall give notice to that effect to the other party whereupon each party shall appoint a person having authority over the activities of the respective parties who shall promptly meet, in person, in an effort to resolve the dispute; (iii) If those persons cannot or do not resolve the dispute, then the parties shall each appoint a person from the highest tier of managerial responsibility within each respective party, who shall then promptly meet, in person, in an effort to resolve the dispute.

Section 8. Miscellaneous Provisions.

(A) *Subletting.* The Engineer shall not sublet or transfer any portion of the work under this Agreement or any Scope of Work issued pursuant to this Agreement unless specifically approved in writing by the City, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. Subcontractors shall comply with all provisions of this Agreement and the applicable Scope of Work. The approval or acquiescence of the City in the subletting of any work shall not relieve the Engineer of any responsibility for work done by such subcontractor.

(B) Ownership of Documents. Upon completion or termination of this Agreement, all documents prepared by the Engineer or furnished to the Engineer by the City shall be delivered

to and become the property of the City. charts, calculations, All drawings, plans, specifications and other data prepared under or pursuant to this Agreement shall be made available, upon request, to the City without restriction or limitation on the further use of such materials PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT SUCH MATERIALS ARE NOT INTENDED OR REPRESENTED TO BE SUITABLE FOR REUSE BY THE CITY OR OTHERS. ANY REUSE WITHOUT PRIOR VERIFICATION OR ADAPTATION BY THE ENGINEER FOR THE SPECIFIC PURPOSE INTENDED WILL BE AT THE CITY'S SOLE RISK AND WITHOUT LIABILITY TO THE ENGINEER. Where applicable, Engineer shall retain all pre-existing proprietary rights in the materials provided to the City but shall grant to the City a non-exclusive, perpetual, royalty-free license to use such proprietary information solely for the purposes for which the information was provided. The Engineer may, at Engineer's expense, have copies made of the documents or any other data furnished to the City under or pursuant to this Agreement.

(C) Engineer's Seal. The Engineer shall place the Texas Professional Engineer's seal of endorsement of the principal all documents engineer on and engineering data furnished by the Engineer to the City. All work and services provided under this Agreement will be performed in a good and workmanlike fashion and shall conform to the accepted standards and practices of the engineering profession. The plans, specifications and engineering data provided by Engineer shall be adequate and sufficient to enable those performing the actual construction of the work to perform the work as and within the time contemplated by the Engineer. The City and Citv acknowledges that Engineer has no control over the methods or means of construction nor the costs of labor. materials or equipment. Unless otherwise agreed in writing, any estimates of construction costs by the Engineer are for informational purposes only and are not guarantees.

(D) Compliance with Laws. The Engineer shall comply with all federal, state local laws. and statutes. ordinances, rules and regulations, and the orders and decrees of any courts, administrative, or regulatory bodies in any matter affecting the performance of this Agreement, including, without limitation, worker's compensation laws, minimum and maximum salary and wage statutes and regulations, and licensing laws and regulations. When required, the Engineer shall furnish the City with satisfactory proof of compliance.

(E) Independent Contractor. Engineer acknowledges that Engineer is an independent contractor of the City and is not an employee, agent, official or representative of the City. Engineer shall not represent, either expressly or through implication, that Engineer is an employee, agent, official or representative of the City. Income taxes, self-employment taxes, social security taxes and the like are the sole responsibility of the Engineer.

(F) *Non-Collusion.* Engineer represents and warrants that Engineer has not given, made, promised or paid, nor offered to give, make, promise or pay any gift, bonus, commission, money or

other consideration to any person as an inducement to or in order to obtain the work to be provided to the City under Engineer further this Agreement. agrees that Engineer shall not accept any gift, bonus, commission, money, or other consideration from any person (other than from the City under or pursuant to this Agreement) for any of the services performed by Engineer under or related to this Agreement. If any such gift, bonus, commission, other consideration money, or is received by or offered to Engineer, Engineer shall immediately report that fact to the City and, at the sole option of the City, the City may elect to accept the consideration for itself or to take the value of such consideration as a credit against the compensation otherwise owing to Engineer under or pursuant to this Agreement.

(G) Force Majeure. If the performance of any covenant or obligation to be performed hereunder by any party is delayed as a result of circumstances which are bevond the reasonable control of such partv (which circumstances may include, without limitation, pending litigation, acts of God, war, acts of civil disobedience, fire or other casualty, shortage of materials, adverse weather conditions [such as, by way of illustration and not of limitation, severe rain storms or below freezing temperatures, or tornados] labor action, strikes or similar acts, moratoriums or regulations or actions by governmental authorities). time the for such performance shall be extended by the amount of time of such delay, but no longer than the amount of time reasonably occasioned by the delay. claiming The party delav of performance as a result of any of the

foregoing "force majeure" events shall deliver written notice of the commencement of any such delay resulting from such force majeure event not later than seven (7) days after the claiming party becomes aware of the same, and if the claiming party fails to so notify the other party of the occurrence of a "force majeure" event causing such delay and the other party shall not otherwise be aware of such "force majeure" event, the claiming party shall not be entitled to avail itself of the provisions for the extension of performance contained in this subsection.

Section 9. <u>Termination</u>.

(A) This Agreement (which shall include any Scope of Work issued pursuant to this Agreement) may be terminated:

(1) By the mutual agreement and consent of both Engineer and City;

(2) By either party, upon the failure of the other party to fulfill its obligations as set forth in either this Agreement or a Scope of Work issued under this Agreement;

(3) By the City, immediately upon notice in writing to the Engineer, as consequence of the failure of Engineer to perform the services contemplated by this Agreement in a timely or satisfactory manner;

(4) By the City, at will and without cause upon not less than thirty(30) days written notice to the Engineer.

(B) If the City terminates this Agreement pursuant to Section 5 or

subsection 8(A)(2) or (3), above, the Engineer shall not be entitled to any fees or reimbursable expenses other and reimbursable than the fees expenses then due and payable as of the time of termination and only then for those services that have been timely and adequately performed by the Engineer considering the actual costs incurred by the Engineer in performing work to date of termination, the value of the work that is nonetheless usable to the City, the cost to the City of employing another engineer to complete the work required and the time required to do so, and other factors that affect the value to the City of the work performed at time of termination. In the event of termination not the fault of the Engineer, the Engineer shall be compensated for all basic, special, and additional services actually performed prior to termination, together with any reimbursable expenses then due.

Section 10. Indemnification. Engineer agrees to indemnify and hold the City of Garland, Texas and all of its present, future and former employees, officials agents. and representatives harmless in their official, individual and representative capacities from any and all claims, demands. causes of action, judgments, liens and expenses (including attorney's fees, whether contractual or statutory), costs and damages (whether common law or statutory), costs and damages (whether common law or statutory, and whether actual. punitive. consequential or incidental), of any conceivable character, for injuries to persons (including death) or to property (both real and personal) created by, arising from or in any

manner relating to the services or goods performed or provided by Engineer – expressly including those arising through strict liability or under the constitutions of the United States or Texas – BUT ONLY TO THE EXTENT ALLOWABLE BY SEC. 271.904(a) OF THE TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE.

Section 11. Notices. Any notice required or desired to be given from one party to the other party to this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be given and shall be deemed to have been served and received (whether actually received or not) if (i) delivered in person to the address set forth below; (ii) deposited in an official depository under the regular care and custody of the United States Postal Service located within the confines of the United States of America and sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, and addressed to such party at the address hereinafter specified; or (iii) delivered to such party by courier receipted delivery. Either party may designate another address within the confines of the continental United States of America for notice, but until written notice of such change is actually received by the other party, the last address of such party designated for notice shall remain such party's address for notice.

Section 12. <u>No Assignment</u>. Neither party shall have the right to assign that party's interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.

Section 13. <u>Severability</u>. If any term or provision of this Agreement is held to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, the

legality, validity or enforceability of the remaining terms or provisions of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby, and in lieu of each such illegal, invalid or unenforceable term or provision. there shall be added automatically to this Agreement a legal, valid or enforceable term or provision as similar as possible to the term or provision declared illegal, invalid or unenforceable.

Section 14. Waiver. Either City or the Engineer shall have the right to waive any requirement contained in this Agreement that is intended for the waiving party's benefit, but, except as otherwise provided herein, such waiver shall be effective only if in writing executed by the party for whose benefit such requirement is intended. No waiver of any breach or violation of any term of this Agreement shall be deemed or construed to constitute a waiver of any other breach or violation, whether concurrent or subsequent, and whether of the same or of a different type of breach or violation.

Section 15. <u>Governing Law; Venue.</u> This Agreement and all of the transactions contemplated herein shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. The provisions and obligations of this Agreement are performable in Dallas County, Texas such that exclusive venue for any action arising out of this Agreement shall be in Dallas County, Texas.

Section 16. <u>Paragraph Headings;</u> <u>Construction</u>. The paragraph headings contained in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall in no way enlarge or limit the scope or meaning of the various and several paragraphs hereof. Both parties have participated in the negotiation and preparation of this Agreement and this Agreement shall not be construed either more or less strongly against or for either party.

Section 17. <u>Binding Effect</u>. Except as limited herein, the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, devisees, personal and legal representatives, successors and assigns.

Section 18. <u>Gender</u>. Within this Agreement, words of any gender shall be held and construed to include any other gender, and words in the singular number shall be held and construed to include the plural, unless the context otherwise requires.

Section 19. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

Section 20. <u>**Exhibits.**</u> All exhibits to this Agreement are incorporated herein by reference for all purposes wherever reference is made to the same.

Section 21. Entire Agreement. It is understood and agreed that this the entire Agreement contains agreement between the parties and all supersedes anv and prior agreements, arrangements or understandings between the parties relating to the subject matter. No oral understandings, statements, promises

or inducements contrary to the terms of this Agreement exist. This Agreement cannot be changed or terminated orally.

Section 22. Relationship of Parties. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed by the parties hereto or by any third party to create the relationship of principal and agent or of partnership or of joint venture or of any association whatsoever between the parties, it being expressly understood and agreed that no provision contained in this Agreement nor any act or acts of the parties hereto shall be deemed to create any relationship between the parties other than the relationship of independent parties contracting with each other solely for the purpose of provisions of effecting the this Agreement.

Section 23. <u>Right To Audit</u>. City shall have the right to examine and audit after reasonable notice any and all books and records of Seller/Contractor that may relate to this agreement including, without limitation, the performance of Seller/Contractor, its employees, agents. and subcontractors. Such books and records will be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and shall, upon request and at City's request, be made available at a location designated by City. Seller/Contractor shall, except for copying costs, otherwise bear all costs of producing such records for examination and copying by City. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties, such records must be made available to City within five business days. The provisions of this paragraph shall termination survive the of this

agreement. (Revised 11/2008)

Section 24. Nondisclosure. Engineer that any reports, agrees data. documentation or other information given to, prepared by or reviewed by Engineer or its employees and agents under or in connection with this Agreement may be proprietary, competitive and confidential information of the City. Engineer shall every reasonable effort to make maintain the confidentiality of such information and shall not sell, license, distribute. disclose display. or otherwise make available such

information to any third party nor use such information except as authorized by this Agreement, upon written consent of City or unless authorized or required by law, court order, or pursuant to a subpoena; provided, however, that Engineer may not release information pursuant to a subpoena without first providing the City notice of the subpoena and a opportunity to contest (at the City's sole expense) the release of the information.

Adoption of 2012-13 Property Tax Rate

Summary of Request/Problem

The City Council has considered an ad valorem tax rate of 70.46 cents per \$100 of valuation for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2012. All meetings, notices, and public hearing requirements related to the adoption of the tax rate have been met in accordance with State law.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE TAX RATE AND TAX LEVY FOR THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2012-13, UPON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY IN THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS, IN CONFORMITY WITH THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS AND THE CHARTER PROVISIONS AND ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES, OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES, IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS:

Section 1

That there shall be and the same is hereby levied and shall be assessed and collected for the fiscal year 2012-13 an ad valorem tax of Seventy and Forty-Six Hundredths of a Cent (\$0.7046) on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) assessed value of property located within the present city limits of the city of Garland, made taxable by law, which taxes, when collected, shall be appropriated among the funds and departments of the City of Garland for the purposes set forth as follows:

For the General Fund - Operations and Maintenance	\$0.3940
For the Purpose of Paying the Accrued Interest and to Provide a Sinking Fund for General Obligation Bonds and Certificates of Obligation	0.3106

Section 2

That the ad valorem tax rate of Seventy and Forty-Six Hundredths of a Cent (\$0.7046) as set forth in Section 1 above is hereby levied and shall be assessed and collected on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) assessed value of property located within the city of Garland, as valued by the Dallas Central Appraisal District of the County of Dallas and the Collin Central Appraisal District of Collin County and made taxable to the City of Garland by law. Assessed value, as used herein, means 100% of market value less the 8% Homestead Exemption.

Section 3

THAT THIS TAX RATE WILL NOT RAISE MORE TAXES FOR OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE.

Section 4

That the Tax Manager of the City of Garland is hereby directed to assess, extend, and enter upon the tax rolls of the City of Garland, Texas, for the current taxable year, the amounts and rates herein levied and to keep a current account of same and, when so collected, the same to be deposited in the depository of the City of Garland to be distributed in accordance with this Ordinance.

Section 5

That all ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are expressly repealed.

Section 6

That this Ordinance shall take effect on October 1, 2012.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING VARIOUS SECTIONS OF SECTION 50, "UTILITY RATES AND FEES" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS, RELATING TO FEES CHARGED FOR VARIOUS SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE CITY; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE AND A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS:

SECTION 1

That Sec. 50.34 (1) of Chapter 50, "Utility Rates and Fees," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 2

That Section 50.35 (H) of Chapter 50, "Utility Rates and Fees," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(H) <u>Customer cities and major commercial-industrial users, specific wastewater</u> <u>treatment; surcharge; review procedures</u>. The wastewater treatment charges for customer cities shall be as follows:

These charges will be based on one hundred (100) percent of the metered volume of actual wastewater discharged into the City of Garland. These rates do not abrogate any provisions under existing contracts between the City of Garland and the individual customer cities, but are supplemental to said contracts.

And further, the wastewater treatment rates for the individual industrial subclasses are to be:

This sewerage effluent will be based on eighty (80) percent of the water volume unless the customer has installed a City-approved flow-measuring device, in which case the total flow will be used.

A commercial-industrial surcharge will be applied if a user exceeds the quality loading data (weighted average biochemical oxygen demand (BOD) and weighted average total suspended solids (TSS)) used in the development of its user charge by fifty (50) percent. When this excess is encountered, a surcharge will be computed which will be the actual cost of additional treatment. This surcharge will be computed by the following formula:

$$S = ((V \times (BOD_A - BOD_R)) \times 0.0001041) + ((V \times (TSS_A - TSS_R)) \times 0.0000648)$$

Where:

S = Surcharge in dollars.
 V = Monthly volume in thousand gallons for the period in which the surcharge is to be applied.
 BOD_A = Actual BOD measurement in milligrams per liter for the period being sampled.
 BOD_R = BOD measurement used to calculate original annual rate.
 TSS_A = Actual TSS measurement in milligrams per liter for the period being sampled.

In the event a customer places pretreatment equipment in the business process or for any other reason improves the quality of effluent, a review process may be requested by the industrial customer. To obtain this review, all of the following steps must be taken:

(1) The customer must make a formal written request to the City Council through the City Secretary for this rate to be examined.

(2) Formal assurances must be supplied that a change in the effluent due to sewerage pretreatment, product manufacturing change, or any other reason must be expected to remain in effect for at least twelve (12) months or until the next scheduled rate review and change.

(3) The customer must agree that the cost of sampling by City staff (or an independent party at the City's election) to determine the new loading factors, plus the cost of two (2) more samples to be taken at the City's own discretion, will be prepaid by the customer. In the event the City elects not to take additional samples or if the next samples are part of the regularly scheduled sampling plan, the cost of the prepaid samples will be refunded by the City to the customer. The cost of samplings will be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) each, for a total of two hundred twenty-five dollars (\$225.00).

The City shall have forty-five (45) days from the date the written request is received by the City Secretary to take action. This will be in the form of a resolution acted upon by the City Council. The effective date of the credit shall be the regular bill to the customer subsequent to the approved resolution by the Council. A rate credit may be in order to be approved by the City Council. The credit shall remain in effect until the next regular rate schedule has been put into effect by the City Council unless the user's effluent increases significantly, in which case the provisions set forth above concerning surcharges shall apply. Should the customer be deemed entitled to a rate reduction, the maximum amount of the reduction to be allowed would be the variable costs associated with the new effluent loadings. This credit will be computed in the same manner as the surcharge as defined above. The City Council may take any action it deems equitable with respect to the customer's rate, but until such action is taken, the customer's obligation to pay rates previously established shall not be relieved unless this subsection is amended by proper Council action.

Prior to the implementation of the proposed rates for each budget year, each customer will have the right to an administrative review of the cost allocations. Computer calculations, work papers and sampling data shall be available for public review during normal business hours.

Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to supersede or abolish the industrial waste ordinance controlling allowable discharges (codified herein as section 22.140 et seq.) and associated penalties."

SECTION 3

That Section 50.50 of Chapter 50, "Utility Rates and Fees," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas is hereby amended to read as follows:

"The following schedule of monthly charges for residential sanitation services shall apply within the corporate limits of the City:

- (1) One-family residence: \$17.58
- (2) Two-family residence on one water meter: \$35.16
- (3) Two-family residence on separate water meters, each unit: \$17.58
- (4) Apartment house units with cooking facilities provided, each unit: \$17.58
- (5) One-family residence and single apartment with cooking facilities on one water meter: \$35.16
- (6) Residents may obtain up to two (2) additional solid waste automated residential containers by paying a monthly service charge of \$6.10 for each additional solid waste container. No residence shall have more than three (3) solid waste automated containers. All solid waste containers shall remain the property of the City.

SECTION 4

That Chapter 50, "Utility Rates and Fees," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas shall remain in full force and effect, save and except as amended by this Ordinance.

SECTION 5

That the terms and provisions of this Ordinance are severable and are governed by Section 10.06 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, as amended.

SECTION 6

That this Ordinance shall become effective on October 1, 2012, save and except for Section 2 of this Ordinance, which shall become effective on November 1, 2012.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS, ESTABLISHING CIVIL SERVICE CLASSIFICATIONS WITHIN THE POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENTS; PRESCRIBING THE NUMBER OF POSITIONS IN EACH CLASSIFICATION; PRESCRIBING THE BASE SALARY AND TYPES OF PAY FOR THOSE CLASSIFICATIONS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 143 of the Texas Local Government Code, the City Council shall establish certain classifications and shall prescribe the number of positions in each of these classifications by ordinance, and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed and approved a budget for the City for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2012, and ending September 30, 2013, and

WHEREAS, such budget contains a program of planned expenditures for the police and fire departments, including changes to the operations and human resources of those departments,

Approval of a variance to Section XII.4 of the Downtown Development Standards regarding required parking lot landscaping.

OWNER

PLAN COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

On August 13, 2012 the Plan Commission, by a vote of eight (8) to one (1), recommended approval of the requested variance.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Denial of the variance to Section XII.4 of the Downtown Development Standards regarding parking lot landscaping. The required landscape island and one large shade tree can be accommodated on the site by shifting the building location slightly to the rear without encroaching into the utility easement or necessitating a loss of a parking space. Furthermore, Main Street serves as a primary gateway into Downtown from the east and from the Lavon Drive/SH 190 corridor. Compliance with current development standards as properties are redeveloped is critical to enhancing the appearance of this portion of Downtown.

BACKGROUND

The property under consideration is located in the Commercial 2 (C-2) District and is undeveloped. The applicant is proposing to construct an 1800 square foot office/retail building on the subject lot. The property is located within the area governed by the Downtown Development Standards. The applicant seeks relief from the Standards' 5% parking lot landscaping requirement and the requirement that one large shade tree be planted for each 10 parking spaces.

CONSIDERATIONS

- 1. The 0.24-acre property has approximately 88 feet of frontage along Main Street. The applicant proposes construction of an 1,800 square foot office/retail building on the undeveloped lot. As illustrated on the exhibit, there would be 9 parking spaces located in front of the building. Nine spaces are required based on the size and anticipated use of the building.
- 2. Section XII.4 of the Standards requires that a minimum of 5% of the total parking area be landscaped, and that such landscaping be located and distributed within the parking area in medians or islands. One (1) large shade tree shall be provided for each 10 parking spaces. Given the proposed site design, this would require a landscaped island approximately 160 square feet

in size with one large tree planted within it. The applicant is requesting a variance from these requirements. The landscape plan is in compliance with the required 5' wide landscape buffer and associated tree plantings along Main Street, and with the required 24" high screening of the parking area from view of adjacent public streets (Main Street).

3. The applicant has indicated that providing the required landscape island and one large shade tree within the parking area would cause the elimination of a parking space, thereby limiting the use of the property. The building is being designed to accommodate retail or office uses; if occupied by retail, 9 spaces would be required. If occupied by office, 6 spaces would be required. The applicant would like to retain the flexibility to meet either the retail or office parking requirement, thereby requiring 9 spaces as shown on the site plan.

The required landscape island, which is approximately the size of one parking space, could be provided, however, simply by shifting the location of the building slightly to the rear. There is no rear yard setback requirement, as the Commercial 2 District only requires such adjacent to a street or residential district. There is also no fire lane required around the building given the small size of the lot. There is a 5' utility easement along the rear property line; however the building is currently proposed to be setback 20' from the rear property line. By shifting the building slightly on the lot the required landscape island could be accommodated without encroaching into the utility easement or into any required setback.

4. The subject property is located along the primary gateway to the Downtown core from the east and from the Lavon Drive/SH 190 corridor. As properties are redeveloped and improved along this important gateway compliance with current development standards is necessary where feasible to the overall enhancement of the Downtown area. Furthermore, the recently adopted Envision Garland Plan identifies Downtown, including the subject property, as one of seven catalyst areas within which public and private investment should be targeted. Enhancement of this section of Main Street is important to achieving the overall goals for Downtown redevelopment and revitalization.

PLAN COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

On August 13, 2012 the Plan Commission, by a vote of nine (9) to zero (0), recommended approval of a Specific Use Permit for Child Care Center per staff recommendation.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Approval of a Specific Use Permit for Child Care Center for a period of 10 years and tied to **Tiffany Enriquez** provided the number of students is limited to 60. The existing shopping center is able to accommodate the proposed use provided the number of students does not exceed 60. The child care center could provide a convenient support service to nearby residents and commuters departing from South Garland Transit Center.

BACKGROUND

The applicant is requesting approval of a Specific Use Permit to operate a child care center Suites 116 and 117. Both suites (shown as Suite 116 on site plan) are located in a multi-tenant shopping center; together they encompass 4,939 square feet. Suite 117 was previously occupied by two different child care centers. The outdoor play area utilized by the previous child care centers remains in place behind Suite 117 and the applicant has the intention to continue the use of the existing play area.

SITE DATA

The subject property was developed in 1984 with a multi-tenant shopping center. The site contains approximately 4.65 acres and has a frontage of approximately 250 linear feet along Millay Boulevard, a second frontage of 420 linear feet along Towngate Boulevard, and a third frontage of 100 linear feet along Northwest Planning Report File No. 12-38 Page 2

Highway. The property can be accessed from Towngate Boulevard and Northwest Highway.

USE OF PROPERTY UNDER CURRENT ZONING

The subject property is zoned Planned Development (PD) 78-87 District for Retail Uses and tied to the regulations of the General Business (GB) District. The General Business (GB) District accommodates a variety of retail, service and business establishments. Although the General Business (GB) District allows Child Care Center outright, within the IH 635 Overlay it is permitted only with approval of a Specific Use Permit.

SURROUNDING ZONING AND LAND USES

- North: Properties to the north are zoned Planned Development (PD) 97-12 for Industrial Uses, Planned Development (PD) 71-7 for Single Family, Townhouse, Office and Retail Uses, Single Family (SF-7) District, and Planned Development (PD) 86-71 for Townhouse Uses. These properties are developed with single family residences, townhouses and their associated amenity facilities with the exception of the property zoned Planned Development (PD) 97-12 which is vacant, with remnants of a parking lot associated with a previous use.
- East: Properties to the east are zoned Planned Development (PD) 85-11 and Planned Development (PD) 94-35, both Planned Development Districts for Shopping Center Uses. These properties are developed with a shopping center and two stand alone buildings that are occupied with a restaurant and a convenience store.
- South: Properties to the south are zoned Shopping Center (SC) District, Planned Development (PD) 11-13 and Planned Development (PD) 07-02, both for Planned Developments for General Business Uses. These properties are developed with an auto repair shop, a bank, a gas station, a Pep Boys and a Family Dollar store.
- West: Properties to the west are zoned Planned Development (PD) 00-21 for Freeway Uses, Planned Development (PD) 79-46 and Planned Development (PD) 69-54 for Light Industrial Uses. These properties are developed with two restaurants, an auto repair shop, an auto dealership, and a hotel.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

The Future Land Use Map of the Envision Garland Plan recommends transitoriented centers for the subject property due to its proximity to the South Garland Transit Center. Transit-oriented centers are areas of concentrated activity and increased density with maximum access to public transportation options. This type of center should be developed as mixed-use with live/work/play/shop opportunities. In addition, the Envision Garland Plan identifies seven catalyst areas for public and private reinvestment and redevelopment. The subject property is located within the South Garland Avenue Catalyst Area. The Planning Report File No. 12-38 Page 3

proposed child care center is consistent with the long-term vision set forth by the Envision Garland Plan and could provide a valuable service to those residents using public transportation to commute to work.

CONSIDERATIONS

- The applicant is proposing to operate a child care center from Suites 116 and 117 in a multi-tenant shopping center. The child care center will operate Monday through Friday from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Enrollment would be open to children ranging in age from 6 months old to 12 years old. There will be no drop-off area, as parents will be required to escort children into the building. The entrance to the child care center is on the south side of the building. Parking for parents will be served by any of the parking spaces on the site.
- 2. The parking requirement for a Kindergarten, Preschool or Child Care Center is 1 parking space for every 10 students. Since the parking area is shared by all the tenants in the shopping center, it is necessary to take into account the cumulative parking demand of all the tenants to determine the number of parking spaces available for the proposed child care center which consequently determines the maximum number of students allowed in the child care center. The parking demand for the entire shopping center without the proposed child care center is 256 parking spaces; there are 262 parking spaces on the site, leaving the remaining 6 parking spaces to be allocated to the child care center. The applicant is proposing to have a maximum of 88 children; however, the 6 available parking spaces limit the maximum number of children to 60.
- 3. Per Section 10-304.2 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance No. 4647 the outdoor recreational area shall be enclosed at all times with a fence which shall be built and maintained with a minimum height of 4 feet. The existing outdoor play area is enclosed with an 8-foot chain link fence.
- 4. The applicant is requesting the Specific Use Permit for a period of 10 years tied to **Tiffany Enriquez**.

COMPATIBILITY OF REQUEST WITH SURROUNDING ZONING AND LAND USES

The proposed child care center would be located in a multi-tenant shopping center that is located between the residential area to the north and the more intense commercial activities found along Northwest Highway to the south. This particular location allows the proposed child care center to serve both as a support service to nearby residential neighborhoods and residents commuting from the South Garland Transit Center who are in need of child care services nearby; and second, as a buffer/transitional use between the residential area to the north and the more intense commercial activities to the south. PLAN COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

On August 13, 2012 the Plan Commission, by a vote of nine (9) to zero (0), recommended approval of a Specific Use Permit for Child Care Center per staff recommendation.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Approval of a Specific Use Permit for Child Care Center for a period of 20 years tied to **Cornerstone United Methodist Church**. The existing church facility is able to accommodate the proposed use in a manner compatible with surrounding zoning and land use patterns, providing a support service to nearby residential neighborhoods.

BACKGROUND

The applicant is requesting approval of a Specific Use Permit to continue operating a child care center within an existing church building. The child care center has operated at this location since 2004. The applicant has indicated they were unaware that an SUP was required. The age of the children ranges from 12 months to 12 years. The applicant is licensed to have a maximum number of 46 children. The child care center operates Monday through Friday from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

SITE DATA

The subject property contains approximately 4.42 acres and nearly 475 feet of frontage along North Garland Avenue. The property has two driveway entrances connected by a driveway that loops around the property. The site can only be accessed from North Garland Avenue.

USE OF PROPERTY UNDER CURRENT ZONING

The Agriculture District is intended for vacant land which is not yet ready for development, land which is used for agricultural or open space purposes, and land which has been newly annexed into the City of Garland. This district functions as a temporary "holding zone" for land until development patterns warrant more intensive urban use. At that time, it is anticipated that Agriculture Districts will be changed to an appropriate permanent zoning classification. The development of the church did not require a change in zoning since churches are allowed by right in any of the zoning districts. However, Ordinance No. 5228 for the SH 190 Overlay stipulates that Child Care Centers on property zoned Agriculture are only allowed by Specific Use Permit.

SURROUNDING ZONING AND LAND USES

The subject property is surrounded by properties zoned for residential uses and developed with single family subdivisions; with the exception of the properties beyond the residential subdivision immediately to the south. These properties are zoned Planned Development (PD) 08-40 for Neighborhood Services and Planned Development (PD) 05-40 for Office Uses and are developed with an animal clinic and a dental office. The residential subdivision to the north is located within the City of Richardson.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

The Envision Garland Plan identifies this location as within the Traditional Neighborhoods Building Block. Traditional Neighborhoods provide areas for low to moderate density single-family detached housing and accommodate convenience retail, office and public services. The child care center provides a convenient and compatible support service to the surrounding neighborhood.

CONSIDERATIONS

- The subject property will continue to operate as a church on the weekends and as a gathering place at certain times during the week while the child care center will operate Monday through Friday from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Enrollment is open to students ranging in age from 1 year old to 12 years old. The drop-off and pick-up area is located on the northwest side of the building; however, parents are required to escort students into the building. Parking for parents is served by any of the parking spaces on the site.
- 2. The parking requirement for a Kindergarten, Preschool or Child Care Center is 1 parking space for every 10 students. The church is required to have 69 parking spaces; the site plan reflects 87 parking spaces, leaving 18 parking spaces for the child care center. The applicant is proposing to have a maximum of 46 students; therefore, the current parking count is adequate to meet the demand of both the church and the child care center.
- 3. Per Section 10-304.2 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance No. 4647 the outdoor recreational area shall be enclosed at all times with a fence which shall be built and maintained with a minimum height of 4 feet. The existing outdoor play area is enclosed with a 4-foot wrought iron fence.

4. The applicant is requesting the Specific Use Permit for a period of 20 years tied to **Cornerstone United Methodist Church**.

COMPATIBILITY OF REQUEST WITH SURROUNDING ZONING AND LAND USES

The site of the child care center is surrounded by residential subdivisions with the exception of an animal clinic and a dental office located further south. Given that the subject property is adjacent to Garland Avenue which is a major thoroughfare and the only street from which the property can be accessed, the traffic generated by the child care center will not impact the capacity of the local and collector streets in the surrounding residential neighborhoods. The child care center is considered a low intensity use which provides a compatible support service to the surrounding single family neighborhoods. The site and church are suitable for the child care center given the location, surrounding land use, and the facilities provided by the existing building.

7502 N. Garland Avenue

- I. Statement of Purpose: The purpose of this Specific Use Permit is to permit a Kindergarten, Preschool or Child Care Center on the subject property.
- II. Statement of Effect: This permit shall not affect any regulation found in the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, as amended, except as specifically provided herein.
- **III. General Regulations:** All regulations of the Agriculture (AG) District set forth in Section 14, 33, and 46 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, Ordinance No. 4647 are included by reference and shall apply, except as otherwise specified in this ordinance.

IV. Specific Regulations:

- A. <u>Time Period</u>: The Specific Use Permit shall be in effect for a 20 year time period and tied to Cornerstone United Methodist Church.
- B. <u>Days and Hours of Operation:</u> The child care center will only operate Monday through Friday from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
- C. <u>Maximum Number of Students</u>: The maximum allowable number of students is 46.
- D. <u>Parking Requirement:</u> A minimum of 5 parking spaces are required for the Child Care Center.


