3. Public hearings were previously conducted for the following zoning cases. Council approved the requests and instructed staff to bring forth the following ordinances for consideration.

a. Zoning File No. 14-24, Vincent Gerard & Associates

Consider an ordinance amending the zoning laws of the City of Garland by approving a Specific Use Permit for an Antenna, Commercial Type 2 on a 0.0826-acre tract of land located at 1880 Holford Road.

b. Zoning File No. 14-25, CEI Engineering Associates, Inc.

Consider an ordinance amending the zoning laws of the City of Garland by approving an amendment of Planned Development District 10-06 for Freeway Uses, an amendment of a Concept Plan, and a Detail Plan for a Restaurant with Drive-through on a 0.93-acre tract of land located east of 150 Town Center Boulevard.

c. Zoning File No. 14-26, Oaks at Firewheel, LP

Consider an ordinance amending the zoning laws of the City of Garland by approving an amendment to Planned Development District 09-28 for Single Family Uses on a 14.01-acre tract of land located south of Campbell Road and west of Brand Road (Oaks at Firewheel).

4. Consider a resolution authorizing a Texas Department of Transportation Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) – Single Year – 2015 Comprehensive Grant in the amount of \$393,719.

The Garland Police Department has successfully participated in Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) – Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) – Comprehensive Grant for many years. The purpose of the grant is to save lives, reduce motor vehicle accidents and injuries, and change behavior related to driving habits. This is accomplished by aggressively enforcing the laws of the State of Texas related to red light and intersection violations, seatbelt violations, speed violations, and driving while intoxicated violations. Council was scheduled to consider this item at the August 4, 2014 Work Session.

5. Consider by minute action authorizing the City Manager to execute Change Order No. 1 with Tri-Con Services, Inc. in the amount of \$363,811.62.

At the August 4, 2014 Work Session, Council was scheduled to consider authorizing Change Order No. 1 to the contract with Tri-Con Services, Inc. in the amount of \$363,811.62. During the construction project, a drainage issue on Hardy Drive near the intersection of Dairy Road, failed paving on Dairy Road just north of the construction area, and additional replacement/lowering of the North Texas Municipal Water District 30" and 36" water main and the City's 16" water main warranted additional work.

6. Consider by minute action authorizing the City Manager to execute a change order in the amount of \$49,905 with Gateway Planning.

At the August 4, 2014 Work Session, Council was scheduled to be briefed on the need for a change order to the contract with Gateway Planning for the land use and entitlement study for the property located around the intersection of Campbell Road and President George Bush Turnpike. This change order is required in order to complete the first phase of this project.

ITEMS FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

Speaker Regulations:

Anyone wishing to speak for, against, or on agenda items must fill out a speaker card and give it to the City Secretary before speaking (cards located at the entrance to the Council Chambers). The Mayor will recognize speakers; he may impose a time limit and may provide for rebuttal. All comments and testimony are to be presented from the podium.

- 7. Hold a public hearing and consider the following regarding an economic incentive agreement for La Fabrica, L.L.C.
 - a. Approve an ordinance designating an area as a reinvestment zone for commercial/industrial tax abatement; making certain findings thereon; authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement with the applicant regarding the reinvestment zone.
 - b. Approve a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a tax abatement agreement.

La Fabrica, LLC is considering relocating a fresh baked goods production facility from Mexico to a vacant warehouse in Garland that was previously occupied by El Rancho (their parent company). The company would make leasehold improvements into а state of the art manufacturing facility/commissary to sell and distribute to grocery locations. La Fabrica is planning to hire up to 100 new hires with at least \$3 million in building improvements and approximately \$7 million in new equipment over the next three years. This project will bring in a total of over \$63,000 to the City annually. As part of the Garland Economic Development Partnership's (GEDP) attraction program of encouraging quality development in the City of Garland, the GEDP's Steering Committee recommends that Council provide: 1.) general support for the project and 2.) support of a 75% City Tax Abatement on new Business Personal Property Value for 10 years maximum of \$369,915. This item was considered by Council at the June 30, 2014 Work Session.

8. Presentation of the 2014-15 Proposed Budget.

In accordance with the City Charter, the City Manager shall submit to the City Council, prior to August 15, a Proposed Budget for the coming fiscal year. The

City Manager will formally present his Proposed Budget for 2014-15. Following the presentation to Council, copies of the Proposed Budget will be placed in each City library, in the Office of the City Secretary, and on the City's website for public review and inspection.

9. Consider a proposal to vote on tax rate for 2014-15.

In accordance with Chapter 26 of the State Property Tax Code, the Council must vote to place on the agenda of a future meeting an action item calling for the adoption of the ad valorem tax rate. This vote must be recorded and must specify the desired rate. This action is required as part of "Truth in Taxation" legislation surrounding setting ad valorem tax rates and does not commit Council to adopting the proposed ad valorem tax rate. Two public hearings will be held prior to the adoption of the proposed tax rate.

10. Hold public hearings on the following zoning cases:

a. Consider the application of Primax Properties, LLC requesting approval of 1) an amendment of Planned Development (PD) District 86-1 for Retail Uses and 2) a Detail Plan for Retail Sales/Personal Service. The property is located at the east side of Plano Road, approximately 200 feet south of the intersection of Plano Road and Walnut Street. (File 14-27) (District 6)

The proposal is for approval of a Detail Plan to develop the site with an Advance Auto Parts store. At the July 14, 2014 meeting, the Plan Commission recommended approval of this request.

b. Consider the application of Linear Architecture requesting approval of 1) a Specific Use Permit for Restaurant with Drive Through, and 2) a variance to Section 10-311 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance No. 4647 regarding the use of metal as a façade material. The property is located at 5235 North Garland Avenue. (File 14-29) (District 7)

The proposal is for approval of a Specific Use Permit and variances to renovate an existing Wendy's restaurant by incorporating EIFS and metal panel on the exterior walls. At the July 14, 2014 meeting, the Plan Commission recommended approval of this request.

11. Consider appointments to Boards and Commissions.

Board members are selected for two-year terms by the City Council in August. Terms are usually staggered whereby at least half of the membership has board experience. Board members are appointed based on qualifications.

- CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Athas called the meeting to order. Council Member LeMay led the Invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.
- RECOGNITIONS: Mayor Athas recognized Parks and Recreation staff members celebrating the 30th Anniversary of Surf and Swim Day.
- ANNOUNCEMENTS: 1) Due to increased mosquito activity, the City will dispatch spray trucks to various neighborhoods when increased mosquito counts are reported. A spray map is available on the City's website, GarlandTx.gov click on the "Mosquito Information" link; 2) Due to drought conditions; Garland is under the Stage 3 watering schedule. This schedule limits residential lawn irrigation to one day every other week based on the recycling pick-up schedule. Hand watering or soaker hoses may be used as needed. No sprinkler use is permitted between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.; and 3) Mayor Pro Tem Jim Cahill announced his appointments to the Garland Economic Development Partnership: Council Member Goebel and Council Member LeMay.

The purpose of this bid is to award a term contract with four (4) renewal options for bulk polymer. This separation produces a drier sludge cake resulting in less weight (wet tons) hauled to the Charles Hinton Landfill.

WHEREAS, The City Council, after determining all legal requirements of notice and hearing have been met, has further determined the following amendment to the zoning laws would provide for and would be in the best interest of the health, safety, morals, and general welfare:

Now, therefore, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS, that:

Section 1.

Ordinance No. 4647 is hereby amended by approving a Specific Use Permit for an Antenna, Commercial Type 2, on a 0.0826-acre tract of land located at 1880 Holford Road, and being more particularly described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Section 2.

Economic Development Incentive – La Fabrica LLC

La Fabrica, LLC is considering relocating a fresh baked goods production facility from Mexico to a vacant warehouse in Garland that was previously occupied by El Rancho (their parent company). AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING AN AREA AS A REINVESTMENT ZONE FOR COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL TAX ABATEMENT; MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS THEREON; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH THE APPLICANT REGARDING THE REINVESTMENT ZONE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS:

Section 1

That the area described in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, is hereby designated as a reinvestment zone by the City of Garland pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 312 of the Texas Tax Code, as amended. It is expressly provided, however, that no tax abatement shall occur unless and until an appropriate agreement, as directed in Section 3 of this Ordinance, is executed by the City Manager and the applicant.

Section 2

That in connection with the foregoing designation, the City Council makes the following findings:

- (1) The reinvestment zone designated and established by this Ordinance is reasonably likely, as a result of the designation, to contribute to the retention and expansion of primary employment and to attract major investment in the zone that will benefit the property and contribute to the economic development of the City of Garland, Texas;
- (2) The area within the reinvestment zone is not within an improvement project financed by tax increment bonds;
- (3) The improvements and development which are sought to take place within the reinvestment zone will conform to the comprehensive zoning ordinance of the City of Garland;
- (4) None of the property located within the reinvestment zone is owned or leased by a member of the City Council or the Plan Commission; and
- (5) The improvements and development sought are feasible and practical and will benefit the land included in the

reinvestment zone and the City after the agreement provided in Section 3 of this Ordinance has expired.

(6) Notice of the hearing at which this Ordinance was adopted was published and delivered in accordance with the law more than seven days prior to the hearing as required by Section 312.201(d) of the Texas Tax Code and as evidence by Exhibit "B" and "C."

Section 3

That the City Manager is hereby directed to execute an agreement with the applicant in accordance with the provisions of Subchapter B, Chapter 312 of the Texas Tax Code in the form attached hereto as Exhibit "D."

Section 4

TAX ABATEMENT AGREEMENT

The City of Garland, in the County of Dallas, State of Texas (hereinafter the "City") and <u>La</u> <u>Fabrica, L.L.C.</u> (hereinafter the "Company"), which will be doing business in Dallas County, Texas (the "Company"), enter into this Tax Abatement Agreement (the "Agreement") in accordance with the following terms and conditions:

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Property Redevelopment and Tax Abatement Act, Section 312.001 et. Seq., TEX.TAX CODE, as amended, (the "Act") authorizes the City Council of the City (the"City Council") to create a reinvestment zone for commercial/industrial tax abatement purposes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has adopted a Resolution establishing guidelines and criteria governing tax abatement and electing to become eligible to participate in tax abatement pursuant to the requirements of the Act, which Resolution is incorporated herein by reference thereto for all purposes; and

WHEREAS, on August 5, 2014, the City Council did enact and adopt Ordinance No. *[INSERT* **ORDINANCE NUMBER]** designating as a reinvestment zone (the "Zone") an area within the City as more particularly described in Exhibit "A," all pursuant to the Act, which Ordinance is incorporated herein by reference thereto for all purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Zone is not an improvement project financed by tax increment bonds; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the terms of this Agreement and the property subject to this Agreement meet the applicable guidelines and criteria governing tax abatement previously adopted; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Company desire to enter into this Agreement to exempt from taxation a portion of the value of the real property (the "Property") or of tangible business personal property located on the Property described in Exhibit "A" for a term as hereinafter set forth, all pursuant to: (i) the Act; (ii) Ordinance No. [INSERT ORDINANCE NUMBER], (iii) The Comprehensive Policy Statement on Tax Abatement; and (iv) the terms and conditions herein set forth;

NOW, THEREFORE, and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the City and the Company agree as follows:

1. <u>Incorporation of Recitals.</u> The determinations recited and declared in the preambles to this Agreement are hereby restated, repeated and incorporated herein as part of this Agreement.

2. <u>**Term.</u>** The term of this Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2014 (the "Commencement Date") and shall terminate on the anniversary of the Commencement Date ten (10) years thereafter.</u>

3. <u>Improvements.</u> Company agrees to build, construct, place, install, and thereafter maintain, occupy, and operate in the Zone the proposed improvements or repairs of the kind, number and in the location as listed in Exhibit "A" (the "Improvements).

4. <u>Abatement of Property Taxes.</u> The City agrees to exempt from taxation those portions of the value of the Property and, if applicable and subject to the following, those portions of the tangible personal property located on the Property as specified in and in accordance with the provisions of Exhibit "A." The exemption provided by this Agreement shall pertain only to the Property, the Improvements and other permanent fixtures within the Zone. Unless specifically provided in Exhibit "A," the terms "the Property" and "the Improvements" do not include personal property of any sort, including machinery, equipment, trade fixtures, inventory or supplies. The exemption for taxable real property provided by this Agreement applies only to the extent the value of that real property for the respective year covered by this Agreement exceeds its value for the year in which this Agreement, if any, applies only to tangible personal property provided by this Agreement, if any, applies only to tangible personal property that was located on the Property after the Commencement Date and related to the Improvements.

5. <u>Access to Property.</u> The Company agrees that the City shall, at reasonable times and upon reasonable notice, have access to the Property and the Company authorizes employees and agents of the City to inspect the Property to ensure that the Improvements are being made and maintained in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement and utilized in accordance with Paragraph 6 of this Agreement. The Company further agrees that prior to the construction or placement of the Improvements, site plans of such Improvements shall first be submitted to the City in order that the City may determine that the Improvements are of the design, character and construction as described in Exhibit "A."

6. <u>Limitation on Uses.</u> The Company agrees that no change in use of the Property, for the duration of this tax abatement, shall be made without the prior consent of the City. The use of the Property shall conform with the comprehensive plan and zoning ordinances of the City.

7. <u>Certification of Compliance.</u> The Company shall annually provide a written certification to the City, on or before each anniversary date of the Commencement Date and on a form to be provided by the City, that the Company is in compliance with each of the provisions of this Agreement.

8. <u>Recapture of Property Taxes.</u> The Company agrees that if the Company fails (1) to make the Improvements as set forth in Exhibit "A"; (2) to create all of the number of new jobs provided in Exhibit "A"; or (3) to maintain and operate the Improvements and the Property as an

ongoing business at any time during the term of this Agreement, then the City shall have the right, in addition to any other available remedy, after giving notice and opportunity to cure as hereinafter set forth, to recapture all property tax revenue lost as a result of this Agreement. The City shall notify the Company, in writing, of a default by the Company in complying with the terms and provisions of this Agreement. In the event that the Company has failed to cure the default(s) within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notice of default [or has failed to commence and diligently pursue such cure within such thirty (30) day period if cure cannot be completed within such thirty (30) day period], the Company shall promptly reimburse the City for all property tax revenue lost as a result of this Agreement and the City may, without further notice to the Company, immediately cause all tax abatement to cease on the Property and Improvements subject to this Agreement. Failure on the part of the City to exercise any right contained in this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of any right in the event of any subsequent default, and no waiver shall be effective unless in writing, executed by both the City and the Company.

9. <u>Use of City Services.</u> The Company agrees to use during the term of this Agreement, electric services, commercial sanitation services and landfill services provided or offered by the City so long as such services are similar in cost for such services in the Dallas area.

10. <u>Miscellaneous.</u>

A. Assignment. No party shall have the right to assign that party's interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

B. Modifications. At any time before the expiration of the term of this Agreement, this agreement may be modified by the mutual action of the parties hereto to include other provisions that could have been included in the original agreement. Any such modification shall be in writing and signed by authorized representatives of all the parties hereto and made by the same procedure by which this Agreement was approved and executed. In no event may this Agreement be modified so as to extend the term of this agreement beyond ten (10) years from the effective date of this Agreement.

C. Notices. Any notice required or desired to be given to or from one party to the other party to this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be given and shall be deemed to have been served and received (whether actually received or not) if: (i) delivered in person to the address set forth below; (ii) deposited in an official depository under the regular care and custody of the United States Postal Service located within the confines of the United States of America and sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, and addressed to such party at the address hereinafter specified; or (iii) delivered to such party at the address hereinafter specified; or (iii) delivered to such party at the address hereinafter specified; or (iii) delivered to such party at the address hereinafter specified; or (iii) delivered to such party at the address hereinafter specified; or (iii) delivered to such party at the address hereinafter specified; or (iii) delivered to such party at the address hereinafter specified; or (iii) delivered to such party at the address hereinafter specified; or (iii) delivered to such party at the address hereinafter specified; or (iii) delivered to such party at the address hereinafter specified; or (iii) delivered to such party by courier receipted delivery. Either party may designate another address within the confines of the United States of America for notice, but until written notice of such change is

actually received by the other party, the last address of such party designated for notice shall remain such party's address for notice.

D. Severability. If any term or provision of this Agreement is held to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, the legality, validity or enforceability of the remaining terms or provisions of this Agreement shall not be affected hereby, and in lieu of each such illegal, invalid or unenforceable term or provision, there shall be added automatically to this Agreement a legal, valid or enforceable term or provision as similar as possible to the term or provision declared illegal, invalid or unenforceable.

E. Governing Law. This Agreement and all of the transactions contemplated herein shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. The provisions and obligations of this Agreement are performable in Dallas County, Texas such that exclusive venue for any action arising out of this Agreement shall be in Dallas County, Texas.

F. Paragraph Headings. The paragraph headings contained in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall in no way enlarge or limit the scope or meaning of the various and several paragraphs hereof.

G. Entire Agreement. It is understood and agreed that this Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any and all prior agreements, arrangements or understandings between the parties hereto relating to the subject matter. No oral understandings, statements, promises or inducements contrary to the terms of the Agreement exist. This Agreement cannot be changed or terminated orally.

H. Binding Effect. Except as limited herein, the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, devisees, personal and legal representatives, successors and assigns.

I. Counterparts. This Agreement has been executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

J. Exhibits. All exhibits to this Agreement are incorporated herein by reference for all purposes wherever reference is made to the same

K. Relationship of Parties. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed by the parties hereto or by any third party to create the relationship of principal and agent or of partnership or of joint venture or of any association whatsoever between the parties, it being expressly understood and agreed that no provision contained in this Agreement nor any act or acts of the parties hereto shall be deemed to create any relationship between the parties other than the relationship of independent parties contracting with each other solely for the purpose of effecting the provisions of this Agreement.

L. Gender. Within this Agreement, words or any gender shall be held and construed to include any other gender, and words in the singular number shall be held and construed to include the plural, unless the context otherwise requires.

M. Construction. Both parties have participated in the negotiation and preparation of this Agreement and this Agreement shall not be construed either more or less strongly against or for either party. Company acknowledges that it has obtained legal counsel to assist in the preparation warranty or representation by the City, that the tax abatement contemplated by this agreement is available in all respects.

PLAN COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

On July 14, 2014 the Plan Commission, by a vote of eight (8) to zero (0), recommended approval of 1) an amendment of Planned Development (PD) District 86-1 for Retail Uses and 2) a Detail Plan for Retail Sales/Personal Service per Staff recommendation.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Approval of 1) an amendment of Planned Development (PD) District 86-1 for Retail Uses and 2) a Detail Plan for Retail Sales/Personal Service. The applicant has worked with Staff to bring forward a Detail Plan that meets all the General Business (GB) District regulations and applicable Development Standards. The proposed elevations satisfy the suggestions made by Staff to incorporate façade elements to accomplish significant articulation and architectural character.

BACKGROUND

The subject property is currently part of an overall site that was developed in 1964 with a 66,400 square feet multi-tenant shopping center. In 1986 City Council approved Planned Development (PD) District 86-1 and an amended Detail Plan to allow the placement of a water kiosk and additional uses. The applicant would acquire a 0.84-acre portion of the 7.62-acre shopping center site and develop this new site with a 6,912 square-foot Advance Auto Parts store.

SITE DATA

The subject property contains 0.840 acres and it will only be accessed from Plano Road through two existing access points, one of which will be an access drive that will be shared with the shopping center site.

USE OF PROPERTY UNDER CURRENT ZONING

Planned Development (PD) District 86-1 allows all those uses permitted under General Business (GB) District including Machine Shop, Service Area, and Warehousing and Distribution with conditions. The proposed use, sale of auto parts, is considered Retail/Sales Personal Service and permitted by right under the current zoning. However, given that the subject property is a portion of a larger site with an approved Detail Plan, approval of a Detail Plan is required to develop the subject property with an Advance Auto Parts store.

CONSIDERATIONS

1. The applicant seeks to develop the northernmost portion along Plano Road of the shopping center site located at 4460 West Walnut Street. The proposed Detail Plan reflects a 6,912 square-foot Advance Auto Parts store with its main entrance facing Plano Road. The Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance establishes a parking ratio of 1 parking space for every 200 square feet of floor area. For a 6,912 square feet building, 35 parking spaces are required and the Detail Plan provides 35 parking spaces. There are 31 parking spaces that currently serve the existing shopping center that will be eliminated with the development of the store. In addition to meeting the parking requirement for the proposed development, the applicant will replace the 31 parking spaces with 35 parking spaces on the same site as the shopping center.

2. Elevations: The façade materials on the proposed elevations consist of painted split face CMU, EIFS, and simulated stone. The applicant has accomplished significant façade articulation by employing column reliefs, molding at the roofline and material/color contrast.

3. Signage: Planned Development (PD) 86-1 does not allow any additional freestanding signs other than the existing multi-tenant freestanding sign located along Plano Road and associated with the shopping center. The applicant seeks to amend Planned Development (PD) 86-1 to place a second freestanding sign along Plano Road intended to be solely used by Advance Auto Parts. The Sign Ordinance allows two signs on a single street frontage with a minimum length of 300 feet. Per the Sign Ordinance, the subject property and the shopping center property are considered one single sign site since they share common ingress and egress from the public street. The Advance Auto Parts building site and the shopping center building site have a street frontage of at least 350 feet. No

variance is required to the Sign Ordinance to allow the additional freestanding sign. The proposed attached signage is in compliance with the Sign Ordinance.

4. Landscape Plan: The proposed landscape plan is in compliance with the Screening and Landscape Standards.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

The Future Land Use Map of the Envision Garland Plan designates the subject property as Compact Neighborhood. Compact neighborhoods provide areas for moderate increases in residential density, including single-family attached and single-family detached housing. These areas provide transitions between traditional residential neighborhoods and higher density residential neighborhoods and non-residential developments. These areas accommodate uses such as convenience retail (goods and services), office space, and public services.

The proposed development is not consistent with the recommendation of the Comprehensive Plan in that it does not implement revitalization strategies such as the introduction of new desirable housing types through infill and redevelopment of vacant or obsolete non-residential properties. However, the development of the subject property with an Advance Auto Parts store is consistent with the current retail development pattern and will strengthen the commercial character of the overall site.

COMPATIBILITY OF REQUEST WITH SURROUNDING ZONING AND LAND USES

The properties on the northwest corner, northeast corner, and southwest corner of Plano Road and Walnut Street are zoned Shopping Center (SC) District, General Business (GB) District, and a number of Planned Development (PD) Districts; these properties are developed with various Office and Retail Uses. The surrounding area beyond the corner properties, is zoned Single Family (SF-7) District and developed with single family residences with the exception of a couple of properties that are zoned Multifamily and developed with apartment complexes. The properties to the west of the subject property, across Plano Road, are within the City of Dallas jurisdiction.

The proposed Advance Auto Parts store is compatible with the commercial character that distinguishes the properties at the intersection of Plano Road and Walnut Street from the residential neighborhoods established in the surrounding area. The service that will be provided by the Retail Sales/Personal Service Use is typical for a site that is near the intersection of two major streets and near residential development.

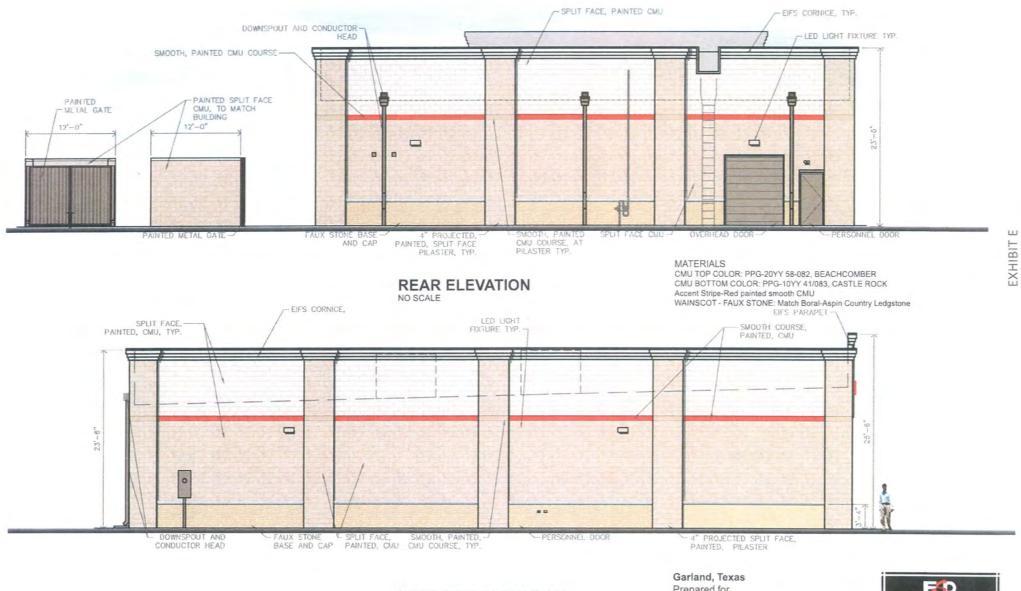

LEFT SIDE ELEVATION NO SCALE Garland, Texas Prepared for Primax Properties July 9th 2014



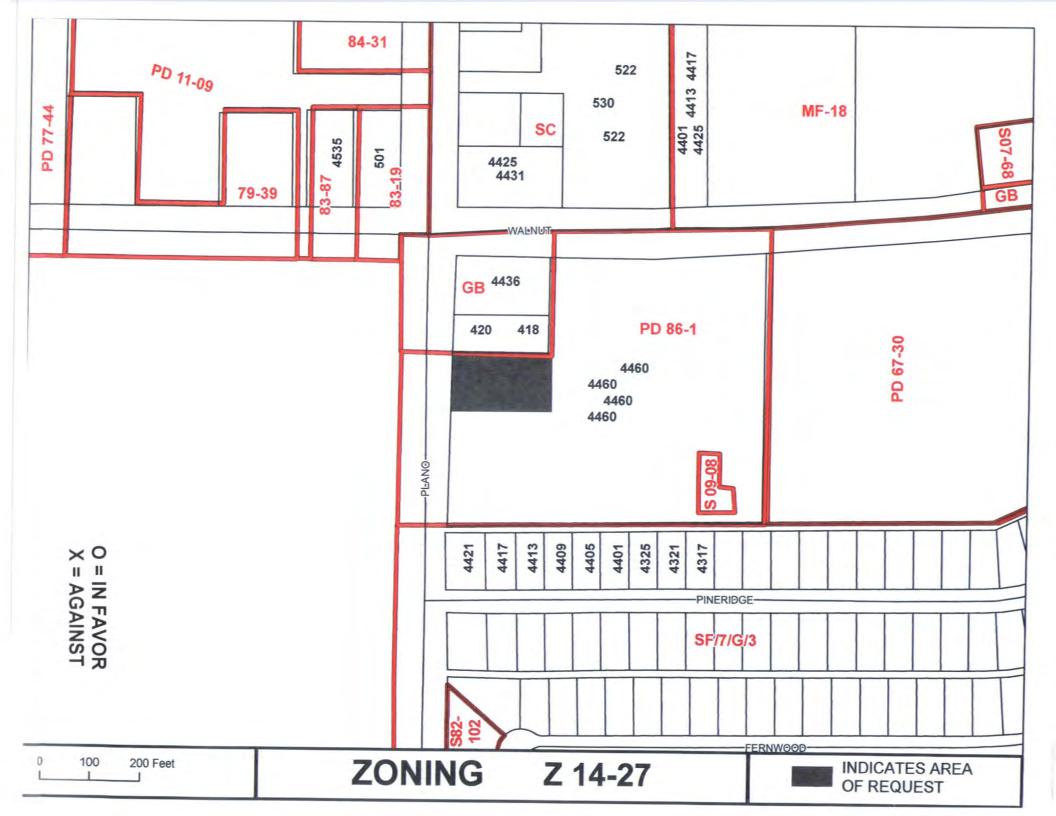

PLAN COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

On June 23, 2014 the Plan Commission, by a vote of eight (8) to zero (0), recommended approval of a Specific Use Permit for Restaurant with Drive Through and a variance to Section 10-311 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance No. 4647 regarding the use of metal as a façade material.

Additionally, the Plan Commission approved variances to the SH 190 Development Standards including to Sections 34.18(B)(1) and 34.18(B)(2) regarding materials on exterior walls and Section 34.21(C)(4) regarding attached signage.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Approval of 1) a Specific Use Permit for Restaurant with Drive Through on property zoned Freeway (FW) District and 2) a variance to Section 10-311 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance No. 4647 regarding the use of metal as a façade material.

The proposed renovation to the facades accomplishes the same objective intended with the SH 190 Development Standards by aesthetically pleasing architecture. Furthermore, the use of metal on the facades does not contradict the intent of Section 10-311 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance as it is applied in a minimum quantity and in a style that complements the architectural theme.

BACKGROUND

The subject property is zoned Freeway (FW) District within the SH 190 Overlay. In 2002, a Specific Use Permit (File 02-10) was obtained to allow for a

Restaurant with Drive-Through Use. The subject site was developed with a Wendy's Restaurant. The applicant will renovate the facades of the Wendy's restaurant with materials and a design different from the materials and design approved in the existing Specific Use Permit; therefore, an amendment to Specific Use Permit is required.

SITE DATA

The subject property contains 0.912-acres with approximately 146 feet of frontage along North Garland Avenue.

USE OF PROPERTY UNDER CURRENT ZONING

The Freeway (FW) District accommodates a broad range of nonresidential land uses including office, retail, personal service, commercial, industrial and institutional activities. A Restaurant with Drive Through is permitted in the Freeway District with a Specific Use Permit.

CONSIDERATIONS

- 1. The applicant proposes an amendment to a Specific Use Permit for Restaurant with Drive-Through to renovate the facades of the Wendy's Restaurant located on the subject property. The amendment is required since the building elevations are a condition of the Specific Use Permit.
- 2. The existing building is primarily brick (primary masonry) with small areas of split face CMU (secondary masonry). The elevations will be modified to include brick, EIFS, tile and metal, as follows:

Elevation	Primary Masonry	Secondary Masonry	Non- Masonry
Front Elevation (southeast facing N. Garland)	Brick/Stone/Tile: 25%	EIFS: 47%	Metal: 26%
Rear Elevation (northwest)	Brick/Stone/Tile: 79%	EIFS: 10%	Metal: 3%
Right Elevation (northeast)	Brick/Stone/Tile: 64%	EIFS: 9%	Metal: 23%
Left Elevation (southwest)	Brick/Stone/Tile: 72%	EIFS: 9%	Metal: 11%

Plan Commission approved variances to the SH 190 Development Standards to allow more than two materials on the exterior walls and to allow for the variation in percentages of primary masonry on the front elevation and the allowance for more than 20% non-masonry on the front and right elevations. Additionally, a variance is sought to Section 10-311 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance which prohibits the use of metal as a façade material in this zoning district.

- 3. The applicant is also revising the attached signage with the renovation. Plan Commission approved a variance to allow approximately 138.5 square feet of attached signage. The signs will reflect the new Wendy's logo along with a quality statement applied on the wall with the drive through window.
- 4. There will be no alterations to the footprint of the building, existing landscape or parking layout.
- 5. The proposed façade renovation will be on a building that is located on a site that has high visibility along North Garland Avenue which is one of the most trafficked thoroughfares into the City of Garland. The applicant is proposing to renovate the facades of the existing Wendy's Restaurant to transform the architectural style of the building to a more urban and contemporary design.
- 6. It should be noted that the renovations are similar to the recently approved elevations on the Wendy's located at 3232 Lavon Drive and the location at 501 West Interstate Highway 30. Both of which were granted variances to the building materials by the Plan Commission.
- 7. The applicant requests the Specific Use Permit for a period of 20 years.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

The Future Land Use Map of the Envision Garland Plan recommends Community Centers for the subject site. Community centers are areas with compact development, primarily non-residential, serving a collection of neighborhoods. This type of development consists of a mix of uses, including retail, services, office use, multi-family residential, and entertainment. Community centers may be developed at the intersections of major arterial streets and along major arterials, highways, and turnpike corridors. The development standards employed to create Community Centers should enhance gateways and corridors as well as to provide attractive, modern developments that create desirable destinations within the city.

COMPATIBILITY OF REQUEST WITH SURROUNDING ZONING AND LAND USES

The subject property is surrounded by properties zoned Freeway (FW) District and developed with a variety of retail sales/personal service and restaurant uses. The properties to the south, across North Garland Avenue, are zoned within various Planned Development Districts for Shopping Center and Freeway Uses and are developed with retail sales/personal service and restaurants with drive through. The update of the elevations for the restaurant with drive through improves the aesthetics of the site and could encourage further reinvestment for surrounding properties.

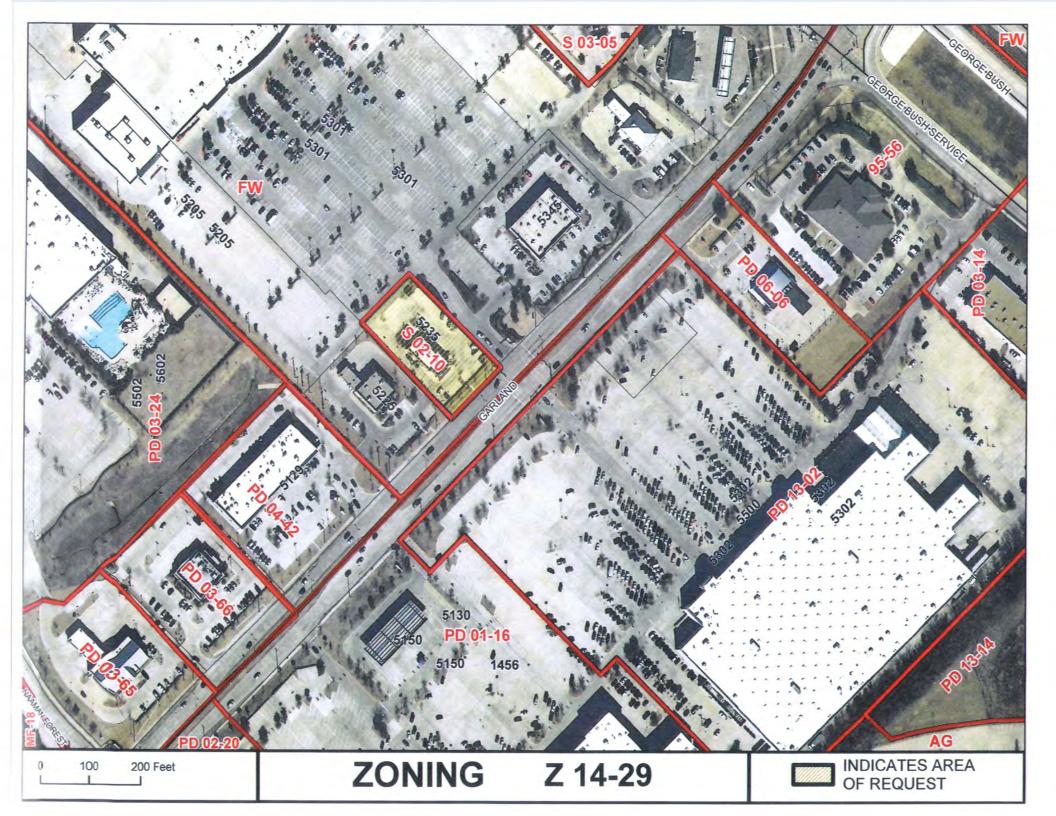

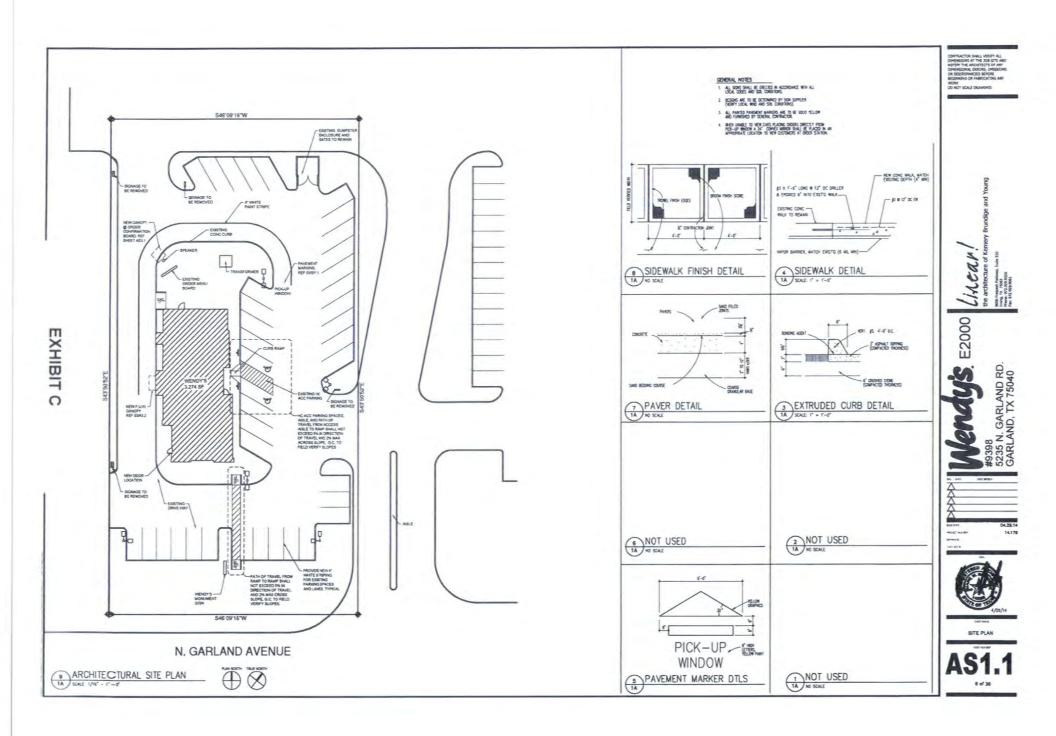

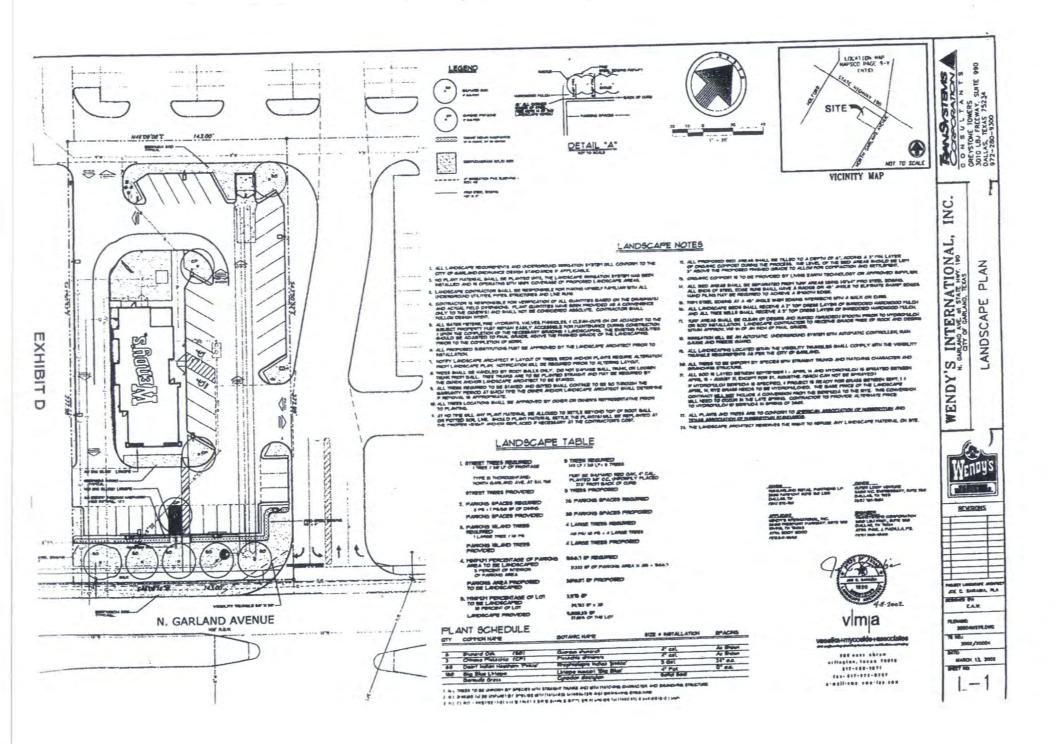

- **II. Statement of Effect:** This permit shall not affect any regulation found in the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, Ordinance No. 4647, as amended prior to adoption of this ordinance, except as specifically provided herein.
- **III. General Regulations:** All regulations of the Freeway (FW) District set forth in Section 31 and 33 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance are included by reference and shall apply, except as otherwise specified by this ordinance.

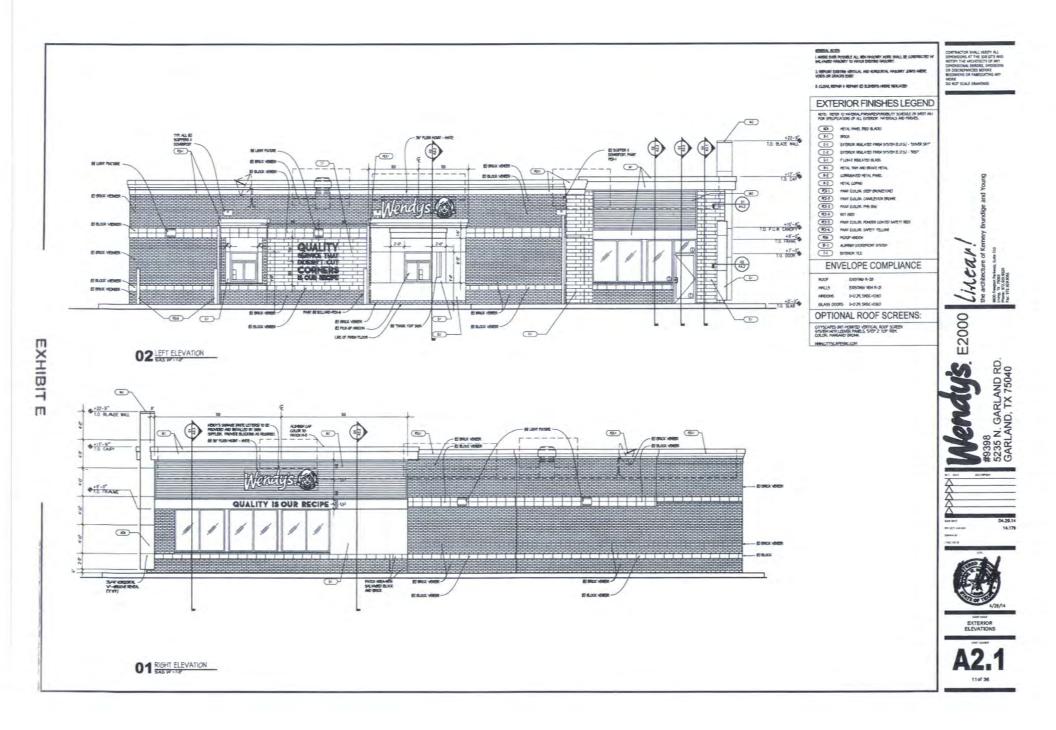
IV. Specific Regulations:

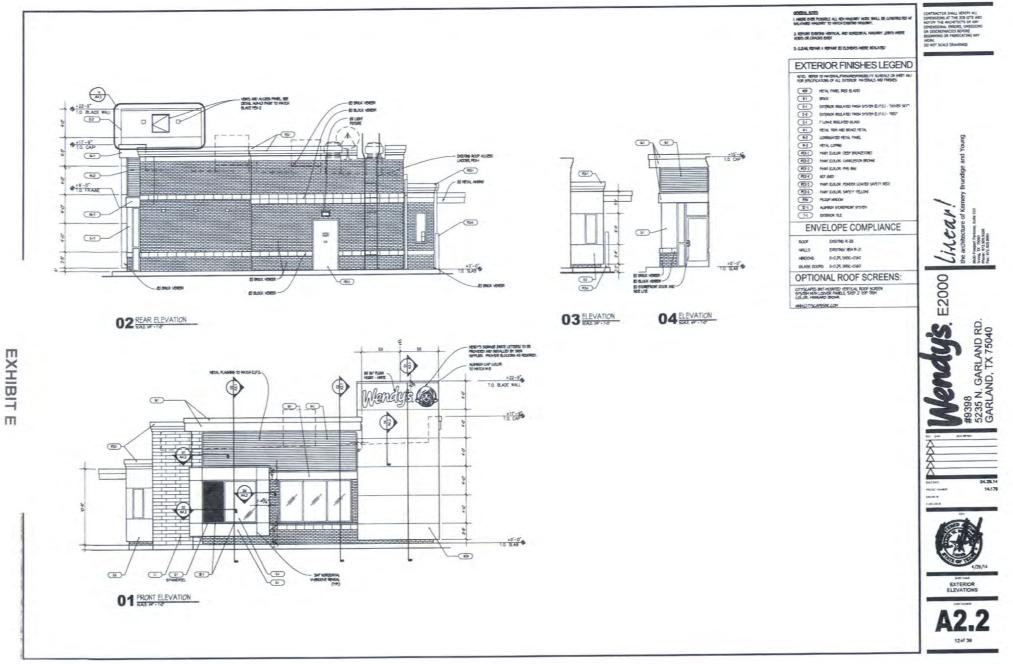
- A. <u>Time Period</u>: The Specific Use Permit shall be in effect for a 20 year time period and shall be tied to **Wendy's International, Inc.**
- B. <u>Site Plan</u>: Development shall be in conformance with the approved site plan (Exhibit C)
- C. <u>Landscape Plan</u>: Development shall be in conformance with the approved Landscape Plan (Exhibit D)
- D. <u>Elevations</u>: The building materials shall be in conformance with the approved elevations (Exhibit E)
- E. <u>Signage</u>: The site shall be permitted a monument sign 7 feet in height, 50 square feet in area, and setback 15 feet from the property line. The attached signage shall be allowed up to 138.5 square feet. Menu board signage shall comply with the SH 190 signage requirements.

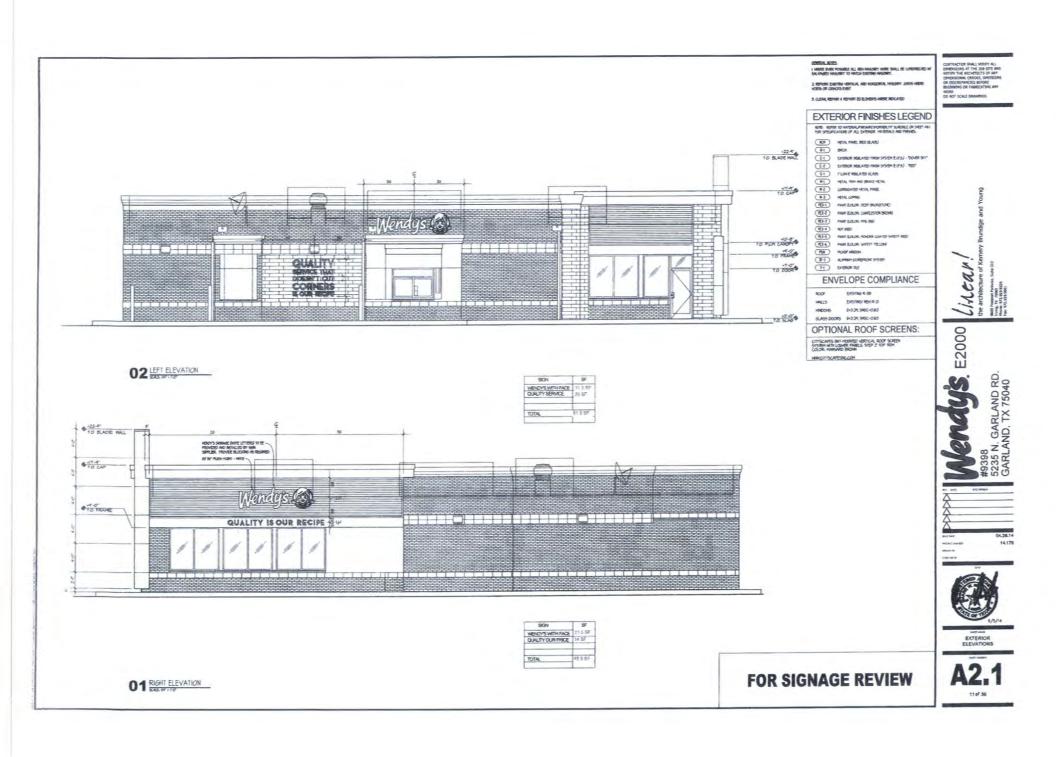

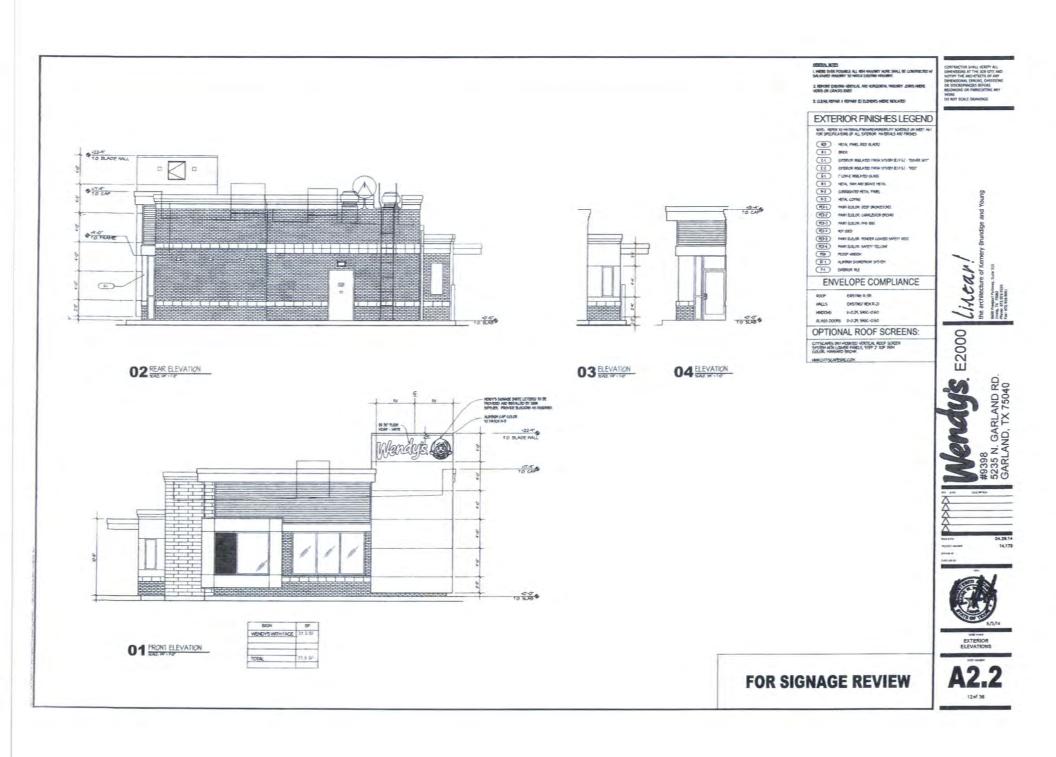

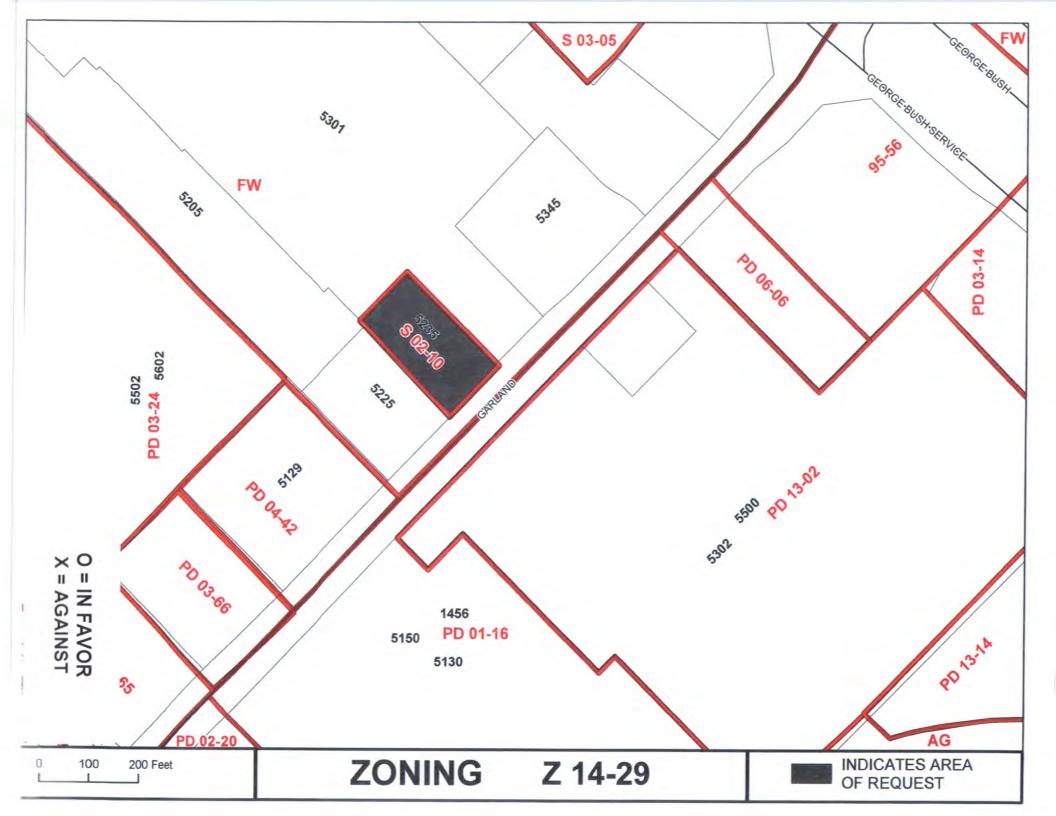

Process For Selection

Board members are selected for two-year terms by the City Council in August. Terms are usually staggered whereby at least half of the membership has board experience. All applicants and incumbents must submit a Board and Commission Application form by July 1. Members of some boards must possess certain technical skills as specified by ordinance. All board and commission members must file a Code of Ethics Disclosure Form with the City Secretary. Applicants will be notified of acceptance by mail after their appointment. Because vacancies may arise during the year, all applications are kept on file for one year.

Qualifications

The Garland Charter and Code of Ordinances establish certain qualifications that must be niet by members of boards and commissions. In addition to special qualifications for service, a board member must

•be a qualified voter at time of appointment;

•not be in arrears on City taxes, utility service charges or other obligations owed the City:
