DEFINITIONS:

 - bidding and pricing information for purchased power, generation and fuel, and Electric Reliability Council of Texas bids, prices, offers, and related services and strategies;
 - effective fuel and purchased power agreements and fuel transportation arrangements and contracts;
 - risk management information, contracts, and strategies, including fuel hedging and storage:
 - plans, studies, proposals, and analyses for system improvements, additions, or sales, other than transmission and distribution system improvements inside the service area for which the public power utility is the sole certificated retail provider; and
 - customer billing, contract, and usage information, electric power pricing information, system load characteristics, and electric power marketing analyses and strategies. Sec. 551.086; Tex. Gov't Code; Sec. 552.133, Tex. Gov't Code]

CHANGE ORDER NUMBER 1 TO BL 5152 TERM CONTRACT FOR READY MIX CONCRETE

ISSUE

Change Order Number 1 to BL 5152 in the amount of \$58,173.15 (a 3.4% increase) as requested by the vendor as a Producer Price Index (PPI) related increase for the renewal of this term contract.

OPTIONS

- 1. Authorize the City Manager to execute Change Order Number 1 with Cooper Concrete Company and allocate the additional funds necessary for contract renewal.
- 2. Take no action.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that Council consider approval of Option 1 and direct the City Manager to execute Change Order Number 1 in the amount of \$58,173.15 with Cooper Concrete Company. If Council concurs, this item will be scheduled for formal consideration at the July 16, 2013 Regular Meeting.

COUNCIL GOAL

Consistent Delivery of Reliable City Services

BACKGROUND

On July 17, 2012, the City Council awarded Bid No. 2976-12 to Cooper Concrete Company in the amount of \$1,710,975.00. Blanket Order BL 5152 was issued on July 27, 2012. The first term of this contract expires on August 1, 2013.

CONSIDERATION

The provisions of this term contract allow for two optional renewal periods. Prior to each renewal, the vendor is allowed to submit a request for an increase in the contract based on the PPI. The vendor, Cooper Concrete Company, has indicated that their costs have increased and they have requested an increase of 3.4% for the first renewal of this contract. Cooper Concrete has been the City's ready mix concrete vendor for several years, and this is the first PPI related increase they have requested since 2007.

Summary of Request/Problem								
The Garland Fire Department and Dallas Fire Department have had an automatic assistance agreement in place dating back to 1989. This agreement was signed and approved by the City Managers and the respective City Councils of Garland and Dallas at that time. There have been some modifications to the original agreement through the years, signed by the respective fire chiefs, due to the standing original agreement.								
The two fire departments began to discuss revisions to this agreement due to the reduction of an engine company at Garland Fire Station 5. The issue is that when Station 5 is responding to the agreed upon Dallas response area, Garland Fire Station 4 is the next closest unit to protect fire district 5. Prior to losing the second engine company, Garland had adequate backup for fire station 5.								
Subsequently, Garland and Dallas have agreed upon a modification of the original agreement, whereby Dallas will respond to Garland's portion of I-635 in return for Garland's joint response to Dallas' portion of I-30 and Rowlett Road bridges over Lake Ray Hubbard, the Barnes Bridge Luminant Power Plant, the 300 block of Gloria Road, Elgin B. Robertson Park, Cypress Cove, Hwy. 190 bridge, and the Miller Road bridge over Lake Ray Hubbard.
