This request is to provide professional engineering design services to produce plans, details, specifications, and bid documents for material and construction necessary to reconductor the Olinger 1 to Ben Davis transmission line from the Wylie Substation to the Ben Davis Substation and replace the shield wire with optical ground wire. Due to the complex nature of this project, an optional contingency is included for any additional work that may be required.

This request is to provide professional engineering design services for the replacement and capacity upgrade of a wood pole segment of the existing 138kV Gibbons Creek to Bryan East/Greens Prairie double circuit line located between County Road 175 and the Gibbons Creek Plan property.

3. Public hearings were previously conducted for the following zoning cases. Council approved the requests and instructed staff to bring forth the following ordinances for consideration.

a. Zoning File No. 14-17, Sargent Design

Consider an ordinance amending the zoning laws of the City of Garland by approving an amendment to Planned Development District 83-10 for Complex for the Elderly and a Detail Plan for an Independent Senior Living Facility on a 1.030-acre tract of land located at 2101 West Walnut Street.

b. Zoning File No. 14-28, Eric Johnson

Consider an ordinance amending the zoning laws of the City of Garland by approving an amendment to Planned Development District 10-31 for Single Family-16 Uses and an amended Concept Plan for Single Family on a 2.426-acre tract of land located at 1080 East Campbell Road.

c. Zoning File No. 14-31, Harlan Properties

Consider an ordinance amending the zoning laws of the City of Garland by approving a change of zoning from Shopping Center District to a Planned

Development District for Townhouses and a Concept Plan on a 13.757-acre tract of land located northwest of the intersection of Belt Line Road and North Garland Avenue.

4. Consider an ordinance amending the tax roll of the City of Garland.

At the August 18, 2014 Work Session, Council was requested to consider amending the tax roll to reflect uncollected ad valorem taxes, as required by generally accepted accounting principles. Although the tax roll is reduced by this action, collection efforts continue unless the costs of these efforts exceed potential revenues.

5. Consider an ordinance amending Chapter 21, "Fire Prevention and Protection," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland.

At the August 18, 2014 Work Session, Council considered amending Chapter 21, Article II, by 1) defining the process for a private emergency service provider to follow when seeking a letter of approval from the governing body of the City of Garland, 2) adding the definition of "transfer ambulance" and removing the work "licensed" from 21.27(A) 2, 3, 4, 5, and 21.27(B) and (C), and 3) allowing for the removal of Section 21.27(A)(1).

6. Consider by minute action authorizing the City Manager to execute Change Order No. 1 in the amount of \$102,000 with APAC-Texas, Inc.

At the September 2, 2014 Work Session, Council was scheduled to consider authorizing Change Order No. 1 to BL 5579 with APAC-Texas, Inc. in the amount of \$102,000 to provide delivery of hot mix asphalt to Street Department asphalt paving project sites.

7. Consider an ordinance appointing Stephen Crane as an associate judge of the Municipal Court of the City of Garland; terminating the appointment of John Weddle.

Due to minor turnover in the Municipal Court, it is necessary to reappoint one of the current associate judges and disclaim the reappointment of a former associate judge. At the September 2, 2014 Work Session, Council was scheduled to consider the reappointment of a current associate judge, Stephen Crane, for a two-year term of office and terminating the appointment of John Weddle. 8. Consider an ordinance amending Chapter 26, "Police-Miscellaneous", of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland; providing a penalty under the provisions of Sec. 10.05 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland.

The Police and Code Compliance Departments enforce the current provisions of Section 26.01 of the Code of Ordinances as it relates to vehicles that remain unattended in public places in excess of 48 hours. This item was considered by the Community Services Committee and the proposed ordinance was presented to Council at the August 18, 2014 Work Session.

ITEMS FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

Speaker Regulations:

Anyone wishing to speak for, against, or on agenda items must fill out a speaker card and give it to the City Secretary before speaking (cards located at the entrance to the Council Chambers). The Mayor will recognize speakers; he may impose a time limit and may provide for rebuttal. All comments and testimony are to be presented from the podium.

9. Hold a public hearing on the following zoning case:

Consider the application of Gonzalez & Schneeberg requesting approval of 1) an amendment of Planned Development District 86-34 for Shopping Center Uses, 2) an amendment of the Concept Plan, and 3) a Detail Plan for a Medical Office/Clinic. This property is located on the west side of Murphy Road, approximately 450 feet north of the intersection of Murphy Road and East Campbell Road. (File 14-32, District 1)

The proposal is for approval to build an emergency medical clinic on an undeveloped tract of land.

10. Hold a public hearing and consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute an economic development agreement with IDI Gazeley.

IDI Gazeley is proposing to develop a 472,238 sq. ft. state of the art industrial building designed to accommodate both manufacturers and distribution type companies already existing in the city limits, as well as new users to the North Texas industrial market. With this new industrial construction, IDI Gazeley will create \$17 million Real Estate value in Garland and will bring in a total of \$119,782 to the City annually. At the August 18, 2014 Work Session, Council

considered a recommendation by the Garland Economic Development Partnership Steering Committee that Council provide general support of the project and provide a Chapter 380 grant in the amount of \$540,000.

11. Hold a public hearing regarding the 2014-15 Proposed Budget.

Section 5, Article VII, of the City Charter requires that a public hearing be held on the Proposed Budget for the coming fiscal year. At the public hearing, all interested persons shall be given an opportunity to be heard for or against any proposed item in the Proposed Budget. The 2014-15 Proposed Budget has been available for public inspection in the City libraries, City Secretary's Office, and on the City's website since August 6, 2014. Previous public hearings were held on August 19 and 28.

12. Hold a public hearing regarding the 2014-15 Proposed Tax Rate.

The Texas Property Tax Code, Section 26.05(d), provides that a governing body may not adopt a tax rate that exceeds the lower of the rollback tax rate or the effective rate until the governing body has held two public hearings on the proposed tax rate and has otherwise complied with Section 26.06 and Section 26.065. The 2014-15 Proposed Budget is based on a tax rate of 72.38 cents per \$100 of valuation, which does exceed the effective tax rate of 68.43 cents due to a 3.7% increase in taxable values and a proposed 1.92-cent increase in the tax rate.

13. Consider an ordinance adopting the operating budget for fiscal year 2014-15, providing budgetary appropriations for the various funds of the City, amending the current budget as revised, authorizing the City Manager to make adjustments.

In accordance with the City Charter, the City Manager presented his recommended Budget for fiscal year 2014-15 to the City Council on August 5, 2014. Copies were made available for public inspection in the City libraries, City Secretary's Office, and on the City's website. Public hearings were held on August 19 and 28.

14. Consider an ordinance fixing the tax rate and tax levy for the City of Garland for the fiscal year 2014-15 upon all taxable property in the City of Garland in conformity with the laws of the State of Texas and the Charter provisions and ordinances of the City of Garland; repealing all ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict therewith.

Council has considered an ad valorem tax rate of 72.38 cents per \$100 of valuation for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2014. All meetings, notices, and public hearing requirements related to the adoption of the tax rate have been met in accordance with state law. Public hearings were held on the proposed tax rate on August 19 and 28.

15. Consider the following ordinances relating to rates and fees:

- a. Consider an ordinance amending various sections of Section 50, "Utility Rates and Fees" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland relating to fees charged for various services provided by the City.
- b. Consider an ordinance amending Chapter 21, "Fire Prevention and Protection", of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland.

In considering the 2014-15 Proposed Budget, Council reviewed the creation of certain rates and fees as well as adjustments to existing rates and fees. Revenue estimates included in the 2014-15 Proposed Budget are based on the proposed rates and fees.

16. Consider an ordinance establishing Civil Service classifications within the Police and Fire Departments; prescribing the number of positions in each classification; prescribing the base salary and types of pay for those classifications.

Pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 143 of the Local Government Code of Texas, the City Council must establish the civil service classifications in the Police and Fire Departments, the number of positions in each classification, the base salary, and the types of incentive pays for each classification.

17. Consider appointments to Boards and Commissions.

Board members are selected for two-year terms by the City Council in August. Terms are usually staggered whereby at least half of the membership has board experience. Board members are appointed based on qualifications.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING LAWS OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS, BY APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO PLANNED DEVELOPMENT (PD) DISTRICT 93-10 FOR COMPLEX FOR THE ELDERLY AND A DETAIL PLAN FOR AN INDEPENDENT SENIOR LIVING FACILITY, ON A 1.030-ACRE TRACT OF LAND LOCATED AT 2101 WEST WALNUT STREET; PROVIDING FOR CONDITIONS, RESTRICTIONS, AND REGULATIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, at its regular meeting held on the 28th day of July, 2014, the City Plan Commission did consider and make recommendations on a certain request for zoning change made by **Sargent Design**; and

WHEREAS, The City Council, after determining all legal requirements of notice and hearing have been met, has further determined the following amendment to the zoning laws would provide for and would be in the best interest of the health, safety, morals, and general welfare:

Now, therefore, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS, that:

Section 1.

Ordinance No. 4647 is hereby amended by approving an amendment to Planned Development (PD) District 93-10 for Complex for the Elderly and a Detail Plan for an Independent Senior Living Facility, on a 1.030-acre tract of land located at 2101 West Walnut Street, and being more particularly described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Section 2.

Development shall be in conformance with the conditions, restrictions, and regulations set forth in Exhibit B, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Section 3.

Ordinance No. 4647, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect, save and except as amended by this Ordinance.

Section 4.

Violation of this Ordinance shall be a misdemeanor punishable in accordance with Section 10.05 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Garland, Texas.

BEING a 1.030 acre tract of land, situated in the J.W. 2101 West Walnut Street

- I. Statement of Purpose: The purpose of this Planned Development District is to permit the construction of an independent senior living facility subject to conditions.
- II. Statement of Effect: This Planned Development District shall not affect any regulation found in the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, Ordinance No. 4647, as amended prior to adoption of this ordinance, except as specifically provided herein.
- III. General Regulations: All development shall comply with Ordinance No. 5410, Senior Living and Related Facilities. All regulations of the Multi-Family District set forth in Section 19, and 32 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, Ordinance No. 4647 are included by reference and shall apply, except as otherwise specified in this ordinance.


IV. Development Plans:

A. <u>Detail Plan</u>: Development shall be in general conformance with the approved Detail Plan set forth in Exhibit C; however, in the event of conflict between the Detail Plan and the conditions, the conditions shall prevail.

V. Specific Regulations:

- A. <u>Permitted Uses</u>: No uses shall be permitted except for an Independent Senior Living Facility.
- B. <u>Density</u>: The maximum density shall be approximately 25 dwelling units per acre.
- C. <u>Setbacks</u>: The buildings shall be setback approximately thirty (30) feet from the residential property to the northeast. The site shall comply with all other setbacks as reflected on the Detail Plan (Exhibit C).
- D. <u>Architectural Standards and Building Façade</u>: A minimum of 75% brick and/or stone shall be provided for each building. Exterior elevations shall be in conformance with the approved elevations (Exhibit E).
- E. <u>Landscaping</u>: No perimeter fencing or screening shall be provided along the western property line and a portion of the southern property line adjacent to West Walnut Street. A six (6) foot tall wrought iron fence with brick columns and six (6) foot tall continuous row of evergreen shrubs shall be provided along the northern and eastern property line and portion of the southern property line. Landscaping shall be in general conformance with the approved Landscape Plan (Exhibit D).

- F. <u>Covered Parking</u>: Approximately 40% of the parking spaces shall be covered parking (12 parking spaces).
- G. <u>Signage</u>: One monument sign shall be permitted on the subject property with the size and setback in compliance with the Senior Living Standards.
- H. <u>Common Storage Areas:</u> A minimum of 1,300 square feet of indoor common storage areas shall be provided as reflected on Exhibit F.

Ordinance No. 4647 is hereby amended by approving an amendment of Planned Development (PD) District 10-31 for Single Family-16 Uses and an amended Concept Plan for Single Family on a 2.426-acre tract of land located at 1080 East Campbell Road, and being more particularly described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Section 2.

Development shall be in conformance with the conditions, restrictions, and regulations set forth in Exhibit B, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Section 3.

Ordinance No. 4647, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect, save and except as amended by this Ordinance.

Section 4.

Violation of this Ordinance shall be a misdemeanor punishable in accordance with Section 10.05 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Garland, Texas.



- II. Statement of Effect: This Planned Development District shall not affect any regulation found in the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, Ordinance No. 4647, as amended prior to adoption of this ordinance, except as specifically provided herein.
- III. General Regulations: All regulations set forth at Sections 15A and 32 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance are included by reference and shall apply, except as otherwise specified in this ordinance.

IV. Development Plans:

A. <u>Concept Plan</u>: Development shall be in general conformance with the approved Concept Plan set forth in Exhibit C. Approval of a Detail Plan shall be required through the public hearing process. Additional elements including, but not limited to, building articulation, architectural features, amenities, entry features, screening, and landscaping would be addressed as part of a potential Detail Plan consideration.

V. Specific Regulations:

- A. <u>Permitted Uses</u>: Only Single Family, Attached Uses (townhouses) shall be permitted. One hundred twenty seven townhomes are proposed on 13.757 developable acres. Considerable variation from the number of proposed townhome units may require an amended zoning/Concept Plan.
- B. Minimum Lot Area: The minimum lot area is 2,200 square feet.
- C. <u>Minimum Lot Width</u>: The minimum lot width is 25 feet for internal lots and 30 feet for end lots.
- D. Minimum Lot Depth: The minimum lot depth is 90 feet.
- E. <u>Garages/Alleys:</u> Front entry garages shall be allowed. Alleys will not be required with this development. A 1-foot minimum masonry column between single garage doors shall be provided on a minimum of 25% of the total dwelling units.

F. Setbacks: Setbacks shall be set forth as follows:



- G. <u>Lot Coverage and Building Height:</u> Building coverage shall not exceed 75% of each platted lot. Building height (apex of structure) shall not exceed 40' feet in height.
- H. <u>Minimum Dwelling Unit Size</u>: The minimum dwelling unit size shall be 1,400 square feet. A maximum of 10 percent of the total dwelling units provided may be between 1,200 and 1,399 square feet in area.
- I. <u>Building Length</u>: Each building shall have no fewer than 3 and no more than 6 attached townhome units or measure more than 180 feet in length.
- J. <u>Additional Parking</u>: Guest parking spaces shall be calculated as one (1) parking space for each four (4) dwelling units.
- K. <u>Exterior Materials</u>: Building materials for the exterior walls and any chimney elevations excluding doors, windows and gables shall be composed of 75% brick or stone, or a combination of brick or stone.
- L. <u>Common Areas</u>: A minimum of 10% of the total developable area shall be devoted as usable open space. Multiple areas of open space shall be provided to the extent that it is distributed throughout the development, easily accessible to all future town homeowners.
- M. <u>Amenities</u>: An amenity center/ pool and open space shall be provided for the community.
- N. <u>Homeowners Association</u>: A Homeowners Association shall be incorporated and each lot/homeowner shall be a mandatory member. The bylaws of this association shall establish a system of payment of dues; a system of enforcement of its rules and regulations; shall establish a clear and distinct definition of the responsibility of each member; and other provisions as deemed appropriate to secure a sound and stable association. The Bylaws for this association shall be submitted to the Director of Planning for review and approval prior to commencement of construction of any infrastructure improvements within the subdivision.

O. <u>Maintenance of Open/Common:</u> Space, Landscaped Areas, Entry Features Access Easements and Other Amenities: Maintenance of all open/common space, common areas, landscaped areas, entry features including any allowed within street medians, irrigation, perimeter fencing access easements and other amenities shall be the responsibility of the Homeowners Association.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 21, "FIRE PREVENTION AND PROTECTION", OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS; PROVIDING A PENALTY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE AND A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS:

Section 1

That Section 21.25 (7) of Chapter 21, "Fire Prevention and Protection", of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(7) <u>Transfer Ambulance</u> means any motor vehicle licensed by the Texas Department of State Health Services constructed, equipped and used for transferring the injured or sick under circumstances which do not constitute an emergency and which have not been represented as an emergency, and which has been certified as an emergency ambulance by another governmental entity."

Section 2

That Section 21.27 of Chapter 21, "Fire Prevention and Protection", of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 21.27 Private emergency service regulations

- (A) It shall be unlawful for any person, either as owner, agent, or otherwise, other than a member of the Fire Department or an agency of the United States, to furnish, operate, conduct, maintain, advertise or otherwise be engaged in the operation of emergency ambulance service, upon the streets, alleys, or any public ways or places within the City, for the purpose of picking up patients within the City, except in the following circumstances:
 - (1) It shall be permissible for a person operating a transfer ambulance in the City, upon responding to a direct call for non-emergency transfer ambulance service, to operate such ambulance under emergency

conditions, using emergency equipment, after notifying the police dispatcher and receiving permission to make an emergency run, when a determination is made by the transfer ambulance attendant that an emergency exists requiring the sick or injured person to be transported with all practical speed to a hospital.

- (2) It shall be permissible for a person operating a transfer ambulance in the City, who is performing the service of maintaining an ambulance at a particular location for a sporting event, to operate such ambulance under emergency conditions, using emergency equipment, after notifying the police dispatcher and receiving permission to make an emergency run, when a determination is made by the transfer ambulance attendant that an emergency exists requiring the sick or injured person to be transported with all practical speed to a hospital.
- (3) It shall be permissible for a person operating a transfer ambulance in the City, if the place of emergency at which the sick or injured person was picked up by such ambulance is outside the City limits, and the ambulance making the emergency run is operated in accordance with Chapter 773 of the Texas Health and Safety Code; provided that the operator first notifies the police dispatcher of the route over which the emergency run will be made.
- (4) It shall be permissible for a person operating a transfer ambulance in the City on an emergency run when Fire Department ambulances are not available, and the fire alarm dispatcher requests the operator to furnish backup emergency ambulance service for the Fire Department.
- (B) All transfer ambulances operating within the City limits shall comply with all laws and regulations of the state.
- (C) Use of emergency lights, siren, or speed above the speed limit by a transfer ambulance is prohibited except when such an ambulance is on an emergency run as permitted in subsection (A) above.

- (D) The City Manager shall have the authority to revoke the right of any person to operate an ambulance under the authority of this section for failure to comply with the provisions of this article. Any person whose authority is so revoked shall have th right to appeal such decision in writing to the City Council within ten days stating the reasons therefore. The City Secretary shall notify the appellant within ten days of the time and place of the hearing by the Council, which shall be within thirty days of the receipt of such appeal. The decision of the City Council on such appeal shall be final
- (E) Private emergency service providers seeking a letter of approval to provide emergency medical services within the City pursuant to Section 773.0573 of the Texas Health and Safety Code, shall submit a written request for the issuance of such a letter to the Office of the City Manager. The matter will thereafter be placed on an agenda for consideration by the City Council."

Section 3

That a violation of any provision of this Ordinance shall be a misdemeanor punishable in accordance with Section 10.05 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas.

Section 4

That Chapter 21, "Fire Protection and Prevention", of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, as amended, shall be and remain in full force and effect save and except as amended by this Ordinance.

Section 5

That the terms and provisions of this Ordinance are severable and are governed by Section 10.06 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas.

Section 6

That this Ordinance shall be and become effective immediately upon and after its passage and approval.

This letter sets forth the terms of your engagement, as an independent contractor, for the position of associate judge of the City of Garland, Texas (the ACity@).

You have been appointed as an associate judge for a term of two years commencing September 4, 2014. In that capacity you will perform certain judicial and magisterial duties as assigned to you by the presiding judge of the Garland Municipal Court. In general, you will arraign arrested persons, set bail for arrested persons, preside over municipal court trials and other court proceedings as requested by the Chief Judge, consider and execute, as appropriate under the Constitutions and laws of the United States and this state, arrest, search, and seizure warrants, protective orders, and otherwise perform and fully report on such duties as may be assigned to you by the Chief Judge of the Garland Municipal Court.

You agree to submit a monthly invoice to the City detailing your hours worked and services provided, which invoice shall be subject to the review an approval of the Chief Judge. You will be paid for your services on a monthly basis in accordance with the following fee schedule:

Daily jail arraignments of two hours of less (including the handling of City Marshal calls regarding transfer of prisoners and, except as otherwise provided below, all warrants reviewed and signed during this arraignment period): \$200.00 per session.

In addition to the fee indicated above, additional fees as indicated below shall be paid for handling the following matters during the initial two-hour daily arraignment period:

Post Incarceration Warrants: \$75.00 flat fee consideration and resolution of all such warrants, regardless

of number.

Emergency Protective Orders: \$50.00 each.

Daily jail arraignments exceeding two hours: \$100.00 per hour for each additional hour required to complete arraignments; provided, however, that the time expended in handling the following matters shall not be counted in calculating additional hours required to complete arraignments, as the fee for those matters shall be individually charged as follows:

Emergency Protective Orders: \$ 50.00 each

Juvenile arraignments: \$100.00 each

Post Incarceration Warrants: \$ 75.00 each

Emergency Protective Orders considered outside of daily arraignment proceedings: \$75.00 each

Execution of Warrants (including search warrants ordering the drawing of blood) considered outside of daily arraignment proceedings: \$75.00 each

Juvenile Arraignments considered outside of daily arraignment period: \$100.00 each

Presiding over Municipal Court Trials or Dockets as a substitute for the Chief Judge or another Municipal Court Judge as requested by the Chief Judge: \$300.00 per session.

You agree that you will make yourself available to perform the duties contemplated herein, and will be diligent and expeditious in handling the matters entrusted to you so as to promote efficiency in the resolution of court matters, and avoid unnecessary expense to the City.

You acknowledge that you are being retained as an independent contractor and not as an employee. You are solely responsible for the payment of all income, social security, employment withholding or other taxes incurred by you as a result of your performance of services under this agreement, and for all obligations, reports, and notifications relating to those taxes. You will not be entitled, under this agreement or otherwise, to vacation pay, sick leave, retirement benefits, social security, worker=s compensation, health or disability, unemployment, or other employee benefits from the City of any nature. The City has no obligation to pay or withhold such taxes. Nothing in this agreement obligates the City to assign a minimum, or any, amount of work to you.

This agreement terminates upon the expiration of your appointed term of office, your removal from office, or failure to hold the qualifications required of a municipal judge of a municipal court of record under the laws of the State of Texas. This agreement is not assignable by either party.

City Council Item Summary Sheet Work Session September 2, 2014 Date: \boxtimes Agenda Item REVISION TO SECTION 26.01 – UNATTENDED VEHICLES IN PUBLIC PLACES **Summary of Request/Problem** The City of Garland Police & Code Compliance Departments enforce the current provisions of Section 26.01 of the Code of Ordinances as it relates to vehicles that remain unattended in public places in excess of forty-eight (48) hours. The proposed revisions to Section 26.01 address concerns brought by recent litigation and are recommended by the City Attorney's Office. The Community Services Committee reviewed the draft ordinance on July 14, 2014 and approved the changes. The draft ordinance was presented to the City Council at the August 18, 2014 Work Session. The revisions to subsections (A) and (B) specifically designate the enforcement authority for Section 26.01. The ordinance revision broadens the regulatory authority of unattended vehicles in public places by including "other designated city officials." The revisions proposed in subsection (C), (E), and (F) all relate to notification methodology to the impounded vehicle's owner. The added language follows current City of Garland practices and tracks the Texas Transportation Code. Recommendation/Action Requested and Justification Staff recommends that Council approve the suggested revisions to Chapter 26.01.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 26, "POLICE-MISCELLANEOUS", OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS; PROVIDING A PENALTY UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SEC. 10.05 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS, A SAVINGS CLAUSE AND A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS:

Section 1

That Sections 26.01(A), (B), (C), (E), and (F) of Chapter 26, "Police-Miscellaneous", of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, are hereby amended in their entirety to read as follows:

Sec. 26.01. Unattended vehicles in public places

- "(A) No person shall allow a vehicle to remain unattended in any place maintained by any governmental entity for a period of time in excess of forty-eight hours. A peace officer or other city official designated to enforce parking laws and regulations may take into custody any vehicle found to be in violation of this subsection (A). Prior to taking a violating vehicle into custody, a notice of violation shall be securely attached to the vehicle for a minimum of forty-eight hours, specifying the violation, the date, the approximate time, and the location of the violation.
- (B) No person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain in any place maintained by any governmental entity unless such vehicle is currently in operable condition or in a state of good repair. A peace officer or other city official designated to enforce parking laws and regulations may take into custody any vehicle found in violation of this subsection (B).

- (C) For the purposes of this section:
 - (1) <u>Vehicle</u> means and includes a motor vehicle, trailer, wagon, boat or other similar item.
 - (2) <u>Place maintained by any governmental</u> <u>entity</u> means and includes, but is not limited to, a street, alley, highway, park or public parking area including the grounds of a public school.
 - (3) <u>State of good repair</u> means the absence of such items as broken glass, substantial body damage (including, but not limited to, crushed or missing fenders, body panels, doors, hoods, or trunk deck) or missing parts otherwise necessary for operable condition.
 - (4) <u>Currently in operable condition</u> means presently capable of being lawfully operated on the streets and highways of this state; being currently registered with proper license plates displayed; having a current safety inspection; and being in running condition without the necessity of first being repaired such as, but not limited to, the inflating of tires or charging of the battery.

. . .

(E) If the City takes into custody a motor vehicle that has been determined to be in violation of the Code, the City shall notify not later than the tenth day after taking the motor vehicle into custody, certified mail, the last known registered owner of the motor vehicle and all lienholders of record pursuant that the vehicle has been taken into custody. The model, notice shall describe the year, make, vehicle identification number of the motor vehicle, set forth the location of the facility where the motor vehicle is being held, inform the owner and any lienholders of their right to reclaim the motor vehicle not later than the twentieth day after the date of the notice, on payment of all towing, preservation, and storage charges resulting placing the vehicle in custody, or garagekeeper's charges if notice is under Section 683.032 of the Texas Transportation Code and, if the vehicle is a commercial motor vehicle impounded under Section 644.153(q) of the Texas Transportation Code, the delinquent administrative penalty and costs. The notice shall also state that the failure of the owner or lienholders to exercise their right to reclaim the vehicle within the time provided constitutes a waiver by the owner and lienholders of all right, title, and interest in the vehicle and their consent to the sale of the abandoned motor vehicle at a public auction.

(F) If the identity of the last registered owner cannot be determined, if the registration contains no address for the owner, or if it is impossible to determine with reasonable certainty the identity and addresses of all lienholders, notice by publication in one (1)newspaper of general circulation in the area where the motor vehicle was abandoned is sufficient notice under this article. The notice by publication may contain multiple listings of abandoned vehicles, shall be published within the time requirements prescribed for notice by certified mail, and shall have the same contents required for a notice by certified mail."

Section 2

That a violation of any provision of this Ordinance shall be a misdemeanor punishable in accordance with Sec. 10.05 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas.

Section 3

That Chapter 26, "Police-Miscellaneous", of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, as amended, shall be and remain in full force and effect save and except as amended by this Ordinance.

Section 4

That the terms and provisions of this Ordinance are severable and are governed by Sec. 10.06 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas.

PLAN COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

On August 11, 2014 the Plan Commission, by a vote of eight (8) to zero (0), recommended approval of 1) an amendment of Planned Development (PD) District 86-34 for Shopping Center Uses, 2) an amendment of the Concept Plan, and 3) a Detail Plan for a Medical Office/Clinic. Additionally, Plan Commission approved variances to Sections 34.19(A)(2)(a)(ii), 34.20(B)(1), 34.20(C)(1), and 34.20(C)(2) of the SH 190 Development Standards regarding building placement, landscape buffer, and screening requirements.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Approval of 1) an amendment of Planned Development (PD) District 86-34 for Shopping Center Uses, 2) an amendment of the Concept Plan, and 3) a Detail Plan for a Medical Office/Clinic. The layout, scale, and design of the proposed medical clinic reflected on the Detail Plan is suitable for the subject property as well as compatible with the surrounding residential and non-residential development.

BACKGROUND

In 1986 City Council approved Planned Development (PD) District 86-34 which encompassed an approximate 23.7 acre area and a Concept Plan for Retail, Restaurant, and Self Service Gas Station. In 2006 City Council approved a

revised Concept Plan and a Detail Plan to develop in various phases most of the original 23.7 acres with a church complex. The subject property consists of the remnant acreage which has remained undeveloped. The applicant proposes to develop the subject property with a medical clinic.

SITE DATA

The subject property contains approximately 1.169 acres and has frontage of approximately 300 linear feet along Murphy Road. The site will be accessible from Murphy Road through two access drives, one of which will be shared with the adjacent church complex.

USE OF PROPERTY UNDER CURRENT ZONING

The subject property is zoned Planned Development (PD) District 86-34 and allows all those uses permitted in the Shopping Center District in the SH 190 Overlay, including Medical Office/Clinic. However, a Detail Plan is required to be approved through a public hearing process before any development can occur on the subject property.

CONSIDERATIONS

- 1. The applicant requests approval of a Detail Plan to develop the subject property with an 8,400 square foot emergency medical clinic. The clinic will operate 24 hours, 7 days a week. Patients will only be held up to a maximum of 24 hours. The medical clinic will not include a trauma facility; therefore, it will not be an ambulance destination/drop off. However, it will include an ambulance entrance which will be used in those occasions when patients are transferred to a hospital.
- 2. Per the Zoning Ordinance, 1 parking space for every 200 square feet of gross floor area is required for Medical Office/Clinic. An 8,400 square foot medical clinic will require 42 parking spaces; the proposed Detail Plan provides 44 parking spaces.
- The proposed building elevations consist of brick veneer and EIFS. The elevations comply with the exterior wall requirements in the SH 190 Development Standards.
- 4. The subject property is limited to 1 monument sign and attached signage. The applicant has indicated that all signage will comply with the SH 190 Development Standards.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

The Future Land Use Map of the Envision Garland Plan designates the subject property as Compact Neighborhood. Compact neighborhoods provide areas for moderate increases in residential density, including single-family attached and single-family detached housing. These areas provide transitions between traditional residential neighborhoods and higher density residential neighborhoods and non-residential developments. These areas accommodate uses such as convenience retail (goods and services), office space, and public services.

The proposed medical clinic is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan recommendation in that it will provide an important service to nearby residents from a site that is conveniently located along a major thoroughfare like Murphy Road. The development of the subject property with a medical clinic will continue the development pattern established by the church complex with non-residential uses that are compatible near residential neighborhoods provided they are located on the periphery of residential neighborhoods and along major thoroughfares.

COMPATIBILITY OF REQUEST WITH SURROUNDING ZONING AND LAND USES

The properties to the north are part of the City of Richardson and are developed with single family residences. The properties to the east, across Murphy Road, are being developed with commercial uses and are part of the City of Sachse. The property flanking the west and south property line of the subject property is zoned Planned Development (PD) District 06-67 for Shopping Center Uses and is developed with a church complex.

It should be noted that the proposed medical clinic is allowed by right in Planned Development (PD) District 86-34 and the Detail Plan put forward is what is being considered for approval. The Detail Plan provides a medical clinic building whose scale is appropriate for a site that is near residential development.




- I. Statement of Purpose: The purpose of this Planned Development is to approve a Detail Plan of a medical office subject to conditions.
- II. Statement of Effect: This Planned Development (PD) District shall not affect any regulation found in the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, Ordinance No. 4647, as amended prior to adoption of this ordinance, except as specifically provided herein.
- III. General Regulations: All regulations of the SH 190 Development Standards and Shopping Center (SC) District set forth in Section 24, 32 and 46 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance are included by reference and shall apply, except as otherwise specified by this ordinance.


IV. Development Plans:

- A. <u>Concept Plan</u>: Development shall be in conformance with the approved Concept Plan labeled Exhibit C.
- B. <u>Detail Plan</u>: Development shall be in conformance with the approved Detail Plan labeled Exhibit C. In the event of conflict between the conditions and Detail Plan, the conditions listed below shall prevail.

V. Specific Regulations:


- A. <u>Permitted Uses</u>: Permitted land uses are listed in the Shopping Center (SC) District within the State Highway 190 Overlay District.
- B. <u>Landscape Plan</u>: Screening along the north property line shall be in general conformance with the screening method reflected on the Landscape Plan labeled Exhibit D. The landscape buffer along Murphy Road shall have a depth of no less than 20 feet; the 20-foot landscape buffer shall comply with the tree plantings as required for a 30-foot wide landscape buffer. All other landscape requirements of the SH 190 Development Standards shall remain in effect.
- C. <u>Building Elevations</u>: Exterior building elevations shall be in conformance with the approved elevations labeled as Exhibit E.
- D. <u>Signs</u>: Freestanding signage shall be limited to one (1) monument sign.
- E. <u>Building Location</u>: The building setback to the north property line shall not be less than 20 feet.







P.C. Meeting, August 11, 2014 (8 Members Present)

Consideration of the application of Gonzalez & Schneeberg, requesting approval of 1) an amendment of Planned Development (PD) District 86-34 for Shopping Center Uses, 2) an amendment of the Concept Plan, 3) a Detail Plan for a Medical Office/Clinic, and 4) variances to Sections 34.19(A)(2)(a)(ii), 34.20(B)(1), 34.20(C)(1), and 34.20(C)(2) of the SH 190 Development Standards regarding building placement, landscape buffer, and screening requirements. This property is located on the west side of Murphy Road, approximately 450 feet north of the intersection of Murphy Road and East Campbell Road. (District 1) (File Z 14-32)

Representing the applicant Robert Schneeberg, 660 N. Central #250, Plano, TX 75074, gave a brief overview of the request. The applicant remained available for questions.

Commissioner Luckie asked if the applicant has spoken with the members of Lake Pointe Church. He also asked for clarification on the allowed length of stay and how many beds this facility will maintain.

Also representing the applicant, Peter Juul, 8314 White Settlement Rd., Ft. Worth, TX 76108 clarified the length of the time an individual would be allowed to stay is 20 hours and the facility would be dealing with low crisis patients.

Commissioner Fisher requested clarification on the requirement of an ambulance canopy and the frequency this would be utilized. Mr. Juul stated that by law they are required to have an ambulance canopy and that it would be used on average about once or twice per week.

Motion was made by Commissioner Luckie, seconded by Commissioner Welborn to close the Public Hearing and **approve** the request per staff recommendation. **Motion carried: 8** Ayes, 0 Nays.

CHAPTER 380

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

This Economic Development Agreement (the "Agreement") is made by and between the City of Garland, Texas, a Texas home-rule city (the "City"), and IDI Gazeley North America. (the "Developer").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City desires to further the public interest and welfare and to induce the investment of private resources in productive business enterprises located in certain areas of the City that will increase sales and use tax revenues accruing to the City, attract additional jobs, increase the City tax base, and promote or develop new business enterprises; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized by Article III, Section 52-a of the Texas Constitution, Section 380.001 of the Texas Local Government Code, as amended, to establish economic development programs and to waive or reduce impact fees and other development fees; and

WHEREAS, the Developer plans to make significant real property improvements within the City, said improvements adding at least \$15 million in real estate value to the City and attracting new business enterprises to the City, and to create a more competitive economic position for the development of the Property, the Developer has requested the waiver or reduction of certain impact fees and other development fees; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes that the Developer's planned real property improvements contribute to the economic viability of the City and desires to provide a fee waiver or reduction to the Developer pursuant to Chapter 380 of the Texas Local Government Code to promote economic development within the City; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

SECTION 1 PURPOSE

<u>Concept and Structure.</u> As authorized by Article III, Section 52-a of the Texas Constitution and Section 380.001 of the Texas Local Government Code, as amended, the City will waive or reduce impact fees due to the City from the Developer as a result of the Developer's improvements at Block 1, Lot 1 of the W.B. Industrial Park Addition of the City of Garland, Dallas County, Texas, more commonly known as 2602 S. Jupiter Road, Garland, Texas

75041 (the "Property"). The waived and reduced fees are set forth in Section II of this Agreement. As described herein, the City's obligation to waive or reduce impact fees shall be limited to the Property; the City's obligation shall not apply to adjoining parcels of land or other parcels of land located within the City.

SECTION 2 TERM

This Agreement shall become enforceable upon execution by the City and the Developer and shall become effective on the Effective Date (the Effective Date being October 1, 2014). Unless terminated earlier in accordance with its terms, this Agreement shall not terminate until Developer completes all requirements listed in Section 4 of this Agreement.

SECTION 3 CITY'S OBLIGATION

- A. <u>General Statement.</u> The obligation of the City to waive or reduce impact fees associated with the Developer's improvements of the Property is limited in its entirety by the provisions of this Agreement. Fees waived or reduced pursuant to this Agreement shall be made pursuant to Article III, Section 52-a of the Texas Constitution and Section 380.001 of the Texas Local Government Code, as amended.
- B. "Impact Fees" (Roadway and Water/Sewer Utility). The term "impact fees" mean those charges to development imposed by the City pursuant to its home-rule authority or state law, and which are generally defined in Chapter 395 of the Texas Local Government Code, as it now exits or as it may be amended or supplemented in the future, and shall include, without limitation, any other type of fee or charge by the City related to development which is designed, directly or indirectly, to offset the costs of roadway and water/sewer utility infrastructure necessitated by the development of real property.
- C. <u>Fee Waiver.</u> The City hereby agrees to waive all impact fees associated with the Developer's improvement of the Property. In no event shall the total amount waived be greater than \$540,000.

SECTION 4 DEVELOPER'S OBLIGATIONS

In consideration of the City's participation in this Agreement, the Developer agrees that the following performance requirements shall apply:

- 1) By December 31, 2014 the Developer shall purchase the Property.
- 2) By December 31, 2015, the Developer shall have completed construction (or shall have caused construction to be completed) of a building with at least 470,000 square feet of

- floor area. Completion of construction shall be evidenced by a Certificate of Occupancy issued by the City of Garland.
- 3) The building referenced immediately above shall be called the "Jupiter Trade Center."
- 4) The Jupiter Trade Center will add at least \$15,000,000 in taxable real estate value to the City. The increased taxable real estate value of the Property shall be evidenced by the Dallas Central Appraisal District's certified value of the Property after completion of construction of the Jupiter Trade Center.

SECTION 5 FAILURE TO MEET OBLIGATIONS

In the event of any default by the Developer, the City may terminate all commitments of the City under this Agreement after providing written notice of such default and 90 days to cure such default.

Also, if the Developer does not meet the performance requirements stated in Section 4 of this Agreement, the Developer shall reimburse the City all fees the City waived or reduced pursuant to this Agreement, subject to the City providing written notice of such performance requirement default and 90 days to cure such default.

SECTION 6 FORCE MAJEURE

All obligations of the Developer and the City shall be subject to events of "force majeure" which shall mean any contingency or cause beyond the reasonable control of a party, as applicable, including, without limitations, acts of God or the public enemy, war, riot, civil commotion, insurrection, adverse weather, government or de factor governmental action or inaction (unless caused by negligence or omission of such party), fires, explosions, floods, strikes, slowdowns or work stoppages, shortage of materials and labor.

SECTION 7 RELEASE AND INDEMNIFICATION

THE CITY SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY LOSS, DAMAGE, OR INJURY OF ANY KIND OR CHARACTER TO ANY PERSON OR PROPERTY ARISING FROM THE ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF THE DEVELOPER PURSUANT TO THIS AGREEMENT. THE DEVELOPER HEREBY WAIVES ALL CLAIMS AGAINST CITY, ITS OFFICERS, AGENTS AND EMPLOYEES (COLLECTIVELY REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS "CITY") FOR DAMAGE TO ANY PROPERTY OR INJURY TO, OR DEATH OF, ANY PERSON ARISING AT ANY TIME AND FROM ANY CAUSE OTHER THAN THE SOLE NEGLIGENCE, GROSS NEGLIGENCE OR WILLFUL MISCONDUCT OF CITY. THE DEVELOPER DOES HEREBY INDEMNIFY AND SAVE HARMLESS THE CITY FROM AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL

LIABILITIES, DAMAGES, CLAIMS, SUITS, COSTS (INCLUDING COURT COSTS. ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COSTS OF INVESTIGATION) AND ACTIONS OF ANY KIND BY REASON OF INJURY TO OR DEATH OF ANY PERSON OR DAMAGE TO OR LOSS OF PROPERTY ARISING FROM THE DEVELOPER'S BREACH OF ANY OF THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT. OR BY REASON OF ANY ACT OR OMISSION ON THE PART OF THE DEVELOPER, ITS OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, SERVANTS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, REPRESENTATIVES, SUBCONTRACTORS, LICENSEES, SUCCESSORS OR PERMITTED ASSIGNS IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT (EXCEPT WHEN SUCH LIABILITY, CLAIMS, SUITS, COSTS, INJURIES, DEATHS OR DAMAGES ARISE FROM OR ARE ATTRIBUTED TO THE SOLE NEGLIGENCE OF THE CITY). IN THE EVENT OF JOINT OR CONCURRENT NEGLIGENCE OF BOTH THE CITY AND DEVELOPER, THE RESPONSIBILITY, IF ANY, SHALL BE APPORTIONED COMPARATIVELY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, WITHOUT, HOWEVER, WAIVING ANY GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY AVAILABLE TO THE CITY AND WITHOUT WAIVING ANY DEFENSES OF THE PARTIES UNDER TEXAS LAW. IF ANY ACTION OR PROCEEDING SHALL BE BROUGHT BY OR AGAINST CITY IN CONNECTION WITH ANY SUCH LIABILITY OR CLAIM, THE DEVELOPER SHALL BE REQUIRED, ON NOTICE FROM CITY, TO DEFEND SUCH ACTION OR PROCEEDINGS AT THE DEVELOPER'S EXPENSE. BY OR THROUGH ATTORNEYS REASONABLY SATISFACTORY TO THE CITY. THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION ARE SOLELY FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE PARTIES HERETO AND NOT INTENDED TO CREATE OR GRANT ANY RIGHTS, CONTRACTUAL OR OTHERWISE, TO ANY OTHER PERSON OR ENTITY.

SECTION 8 PERSONAL LIABILITY OF PUBLIC OFFICIALS

No employee of the City, nor any councilmember or agent of the City, shall be personally responsible for any liability arising under or growing out of this Agreement.

SECTION 9 COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS, ORDINANCES, RULES, AND REGULATIONS

This Agreement will be subject to all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations, including, but not limited to, all provisions of the City's Charter, codes, and ordinances, as amended.

SECTION 10 GOVERNMENTAL POWERS

It is understood that by execution of this Agreement, the City does not waive or surrender any of its governmental powers or immunities that are outside of the terms, obligations, and conditions of this Agreement.

SECTION 11 JOINT DRAFTING

The City and the Developer hereby acknowledge and represent that they have jointly drafted this Agreement.

SECTION 12 INFORMATION/COMPLIANCE

During the term of this Agreement, the City shall periodically request from the Developer an affidavit affirming that the Developer is in compliance with each of the provisions of this Agreement. The City's request for an affidavit shall be in writing and shall be directed to the Developer's address identified in this Agreement. Within 30 days of receiving the City's request, the Developer shall provide the City with the requested affidavit. The Developer's failure or refusal to respond shall be considered a default by the Developer. The City may terminate all commitments of the City under this Agreement after providing the Developer with written notice of such default and 90 days to cure such default, except as provided for elsewhere herein.

SECTION 13 MISCELLANEOUS

The following miscellaneous provisions are a part of this Agreement:

- A. <u>Entire Agreement.</u> This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement of the parties as to the matters set forth in this Agreement. No alteration of or amendment to this Agreement shall be effective unless given in writing and signed by the party or parties sought to be charged or bound by the alteration or amendment.
- B. <u>Binding Effect, Successors and Assigns.</u> The terms and conditions of this Agreement are binding upon the successors and assigns of the parties hereto. This Agreement, or the right to receive grant payments, pursuant to this Agreement, may not be assigned, in whole or in part, without the express written consent of the City Council or the City Manager. For purposes of this Agreement, performance by a successor or an affiliate of Developer, or performance by a party with whom Developer or its affiliates contract shall be deemed to be performance by Developer.
- C. <u>Amendments.</u> No modifications or amendments to this Agreement shall be valid unless in writing and signed by the signatories hereto or their heirs, successors and assigns.
- D. <u>Governing Law.</u> This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the parties created hereunder are performable in Dallas County, Texas. Venue for any action arising under this Agreement shall lie in Dallas County, Texas.

- E. <u>Authority to Sign.</u> This Agreement shall become a binding obligation on the signatories upon execution by all signatories hereto. City warrants and represents that the individual executing this Agreement on behalf of City has full authority to execute this Agreement and bind City to the same. Developer warrants and represents that the individual executing this Agreement on its behalf has full authority to execute this Agreement and bind Developer to the same.
- F. <u>Council Resolution.</u> City Council has authorized the City Manager to execute this Agreement on behalf of City by City Council Resolution Number _____(#) approved on _____(date).
- G. <u>Severability.</u> In the event any provision of this Agreement shall be determined by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, the Agreement shall, to the extent reasonably possible, remain in force as to the balance of its provisions as if such invalid provision were not a part hereof.
- H. **Recitals.** The recitals to this Agreement are incorporated herein.
- I. <u>Notice.</u> All notices required to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be given by either party or its counsel in person, via an express mail service or via courier or via receipted facsimile transmission (but only if duplicate notice is also given via express mail service or via courier or via certified mail) or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the respective parties at the below addresses (or at such other address as a party may hereafter designate for itself by notice to the other party as required hereby). All notices given pursuant to this paragraph shall be deemed effective, as applicable, on the date such notice may be given in person, next business day following the date on which such communication is transferred via facsimile transmission, or as applicable, deposited with the express mail service, courier, or in the United States mails. Any party may change its address for notices under this Agreement by giving formal written notice to the other parties, specifying that the purpose of the notice is to change the party's address.

Public Hearing on 2014-15 Proposed Tax Rate

Summary of Request/Problem

The Texas Property Tax Code, Section 26.05 (d), provides that a governing body may not adopt a tax rate that exceeds the lower of the rollback tax rate or the effective rate until the governing body has held two public hearings on the proposed tax rate and has otherwise complied with Section 26.06 and Section 26.065. The 2014-15 Proposed Budget is based on a tax rate of 72.38 cents per \$100 of valuation, which does exceed the effective tax rate of 68.43 cents due to a 3.7% increase in taxable values and a proposed 1.92-cent increase in the tax rate.

This budget will raise more total property taxes than last year's budget by \$4,010,179 or 5.61%, and of that amount, \$696,540 is tax revenue to be raised from new property added to the tax roll this year.

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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING VARIOUS SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 50, "UTILITY RATES AND FEES," OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS, RELATING TO FEES FOR VARIOUS SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE CITY; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE, A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS:

SECTION 1

That Sec. 50.34(1) of Chapter 50, "Utility Rates and Fees," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 50.34 Water service rates established

The rates charged for water used by customers of the municipal water system of the City shall be on the following basis for each customer:

- (1) Residential, commercial and industrial rates.
 - (a) <u>Residential</u>.

That Sec. 50.35 of Chapter 50, "Utility Rates and Fees," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

(A) Residential users.

(1) <u>Single-family residential users</u>.

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Volume charge \$4.50 per 1,000 gallons

Minimum monthly charge equals the customer charge per month. Maximum volume charge will not exceed a ceiling of 17,000 gallons per month. Volume charge is based on ninety-eight percent (98%) of metered water consumption. Maximum charge will not exceed the customer charge plus volume charge for 17,000 gallons per month.

Bills will be based on ninety-eight percent (98%) of the actual water volume not to exceed the customer's individual ceiling. The individual ceiling is ninety-eight percent (98%) of the average metered water volume billed during the previous December–March period for that specific customer. In the event at least three of the four months are not complete months for that specific customer, the customer shall be billed based on seventy percent (70%) of the actual water volume.

(2) <u>Duplex dwelling residential users.</u>

Minimum monthly charge equals the customer charge per month. Maximum volume charge will not exceed a ceiling of 34,000 gallons per month. Volume charge is based

Bills will be based on ninety-eight percent (98%) of the actual water volume not to exceed the customer's individual ceiling. The individual ceiling is ninety-eight percent (98%) of the average metered water volume billed during the previous December–March period for that specific customer.

(3) Apartment dwelling residential users.

Volume charge \$4.50 per 1,000 gallons

Minimum monthly charge equals the customer charge per month. Volume charge is unrestricted. Volume charge is based on eighty percent (80%) of metered water consumption.

(B) <u>General commercial/industrial users</u>.

Minimum monthly charge equals the customer charge per month. Volume charge is unrestricted. Volume charge is based on eighty percent (80%) of metered water consumption.

- (C) <u>Major commercial/industrial users</u>. A separate subclass and rate may be established for major commercial and industrial users.
- (D) <u>Delayed payment charges</u>. Delayed payment charges shall be made in accordance with section 50.34(5).
- (E) <u>Outside City limits</u>. Charges for service outside the City limits shall be as established by service contract.
- (F) <u>Tax adjustment clause</u>. Bills may be increased by the proportionate part of any new tax, or increased rate of tax, or governmental imposition or charge (except state, county, City and special district ad valorem taxes, payments in lieu of taxes, and any taxes on net income) levied or assessed against the municipal wastewater utility or upon its business as a result of any new or amended laws after enactment of this section.
- (G) <u>Customer cities and major commercial/industrial users, specific wastewater treatment; surcharge; review procedures.</u> The wastewater treatment charges for customer cities shall be as follows:

This sewerage effluent will be based on eighty percent (80%) of the water volume unless the customer has installed a City-approved flow-measuring device, in which case the total flow will be used.

A commercial/industrial surcharge will be applied if a user exceeds the quality loading data (weighted average biochemical oxygen demand (BOD) and weighted average total suspended solids (TSS)) used in the development of its user charge by fifty (50) percent. When this excess is encountered, a surcharge will be computed which will be the actual cost of additional treatment. This surcharge will be computed by the following formula:

$$S = ((V \times (BOD_A - BOD_R)) \times 0.0001041) + ((V \times (TSS_A - TSS_R)) \times 0.0000648)$$

Where:

S = Surcharge in dollars.

V = Monthly volume in thousand gallons for the period in which the surcharge is to be applied.

BOD_A = Actual BOD measurement in milligrams per liter for the period being sampled.

 BOD_R = BOD measurement used to calculate original annual rate.

 TSS_A = Actual TSS measurement in milligrams per liter for the period being sampled.

 TSS_R = TSS measurement used to calculate the original annual rate.

In the event a customer places pretreatment equipment in the business process or for any other reason improves the quality of effluent, a review process may be requested by the industrial customer. To obtain this review, all of the following steps must be taken:

- (1) The customer must make a formal written request to the City Council through the City Secretary for this rate to be examined.
- (2) Formal assurances must be supplied that a change in the effluent due to sewerage pretreatment, product manufacturing change, or any other reason must be expected to remain in effect for at least twelve (12) months or until the next scheduled rate review and change.
- (3) The customer must agree that the cost of sampling by City staff (or an independent party at the City's election) to determine the new loading factors, plus the cost of two (2) more samples to be taken at the City's own discretion, will be prepaid by the customer. In the event the City elects not to take additional samples or if the next samples are part of the regularly scheduled sampling plan, the cost of the prepaid samples will be refunded by the City to the customer. The cost of samplings will be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) each, for a total of two hundred twenty-five dollars (\$225.00).

The City shall have forty-five (45) days from the date the written request is received by the City Secretary to take action. This will be in the form of a resolution acted upon by the City Council. The effective date of the credit shall be the regular bill to the customer subsequent to the approved resolution by the Council. A rate credit may be in order to be approved by the City Council. The credit shall remain in effect until the next regular rate schedule has been put into effect by the City Council unless the user's effluent increases significantly, in which case the provisions set forth above concerning surcharges shall apply. Should the customer be deemed entitled to a rate reduction, the maximum amount of the reduction to be allowed would be the variable costs associated with the new effluent loadings. This credit will be computed in the same manner as the surcharge as defined above. The City Council may take any action it deems equitable with respect to the customer's rate, but until such action is taken, the customer's obligation to pay rates previously established shall not be relieved unless this subsection is amended by proper Council action.

Prior to the implementation of the proposed rates for each budget year, each customer will have the right to an administrative review of the cost allocations. Computer calculations, work papers and sampling data shall be available for public review during normal business hours.

Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to supersede or abolish the industrial waste ordinance controlling allowable discharges (codified herein as section 22.140 et seq.) and associated penalties.

SECTION 3

That Sec. 50.50 of Chapter 50, "Utility Rates and Fees," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 50.50. Residential monthly charges.

The following schedule of monthly charges for residential sanitation services shall apply within the corporate limits of the City:

(1) One-family residence	\$19.58

- (1) For as-needed pickups, the monthly fee shall be thirty-four dollars and twelve cents (\$34.97) plus pickup charge of eighty-six cents (\$0.88) per cubic yard. As-needed pickups shall not exceed three (3) pickups per month.
- (2) Regular pickup customers requesting an extra pickup will be required to pay by cash or by check at the time the pickup is made. The charge for such special pickups shall be \$28.44.
- (3) Customers using compactors in conjunction with containers will be charged the above Page 8 of 10

rates plus fifty (50) percent.

- (4) Where more than one customer uses the same container, the Managing Director of Environmental Waste Services or his representative shall prorate each customer's share in a fair and equitable basis, using the volume of refuse generated by each so as to arrive at a total dollar value equal to the above rates. Each customer sharing a container shall be jointly and severally liable for the cost of the container as if the container were not shared between customers.
- (5) When an existing or prospective customer requires a service for which the above rates do not pertain, and the Environmental Waste Services Department has the capability and desire to provide that service, the Managing Director of Environmental Waste Services will determine the charges based upon a study to determine the cost of providing such service.
- (C) Where more than one building or apartment or other subdivision of space in any residence or commercial building is served by Environmental Waste Services Department, each such additional building, apartment, or other subdivision of space shall be deemed a separate service, and a separate charge shall be made therefore and collected by the Environmental Waste Services Department. The foregoing shall not apply to hotels or rooming houses where light housekeeping is not done and where the owner or occupant lets only one or more rooms that are not separated as apartments with separate kitchen facilities.
- (D) The following rates are applicable to roll off containers and compacting services.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 21, "FIRE PREVENTION AND PROTECTION", OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE AND A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARLAND, TEXAS:

SECTION 1

That Section 21.03 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, only where it amends the 2009 edition of the International Fire Code by adding a new Section 105.2.5(6), is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

105.2.5(6)

"The Bureau of Fire Prevention shall inspect annually: (i) Assembly – Group A Occupancies; (ii) Educational – Group E Occupancies; (iii) Institutional – Group I Occupancies; (iv) buildings 5,000 square feet and larger; and (v) inspections required by a State law, rule, or regulation.

A facility that does not meet applicable requirements at the first inspection shall be re-inspected. The first re-inspection shall be conducted free of charge. The second re-inspection shall be \$35.00. The third and all subsequent re-inspections shall be \$50.00 per inspection.

SECTION 2

That Chapter 21, "Fire Prevention and Protection", of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas, as amended, shall be and remain in full force and effect save and except as amended by this Ordinance.

SECTION 3

That the terms and provisions of this Ordinance are severable and are governed by Sec. 10.06 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Garland, Texas.

SECTION 4

That this Ordinance shall be and become effective immediately upon and after its passage and approval.

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
